Linda, who loved her chosen nickname
"Lindsay", passed away peacefully on
August 5, 2007 after a long and
courageous fight with cancer. Her last
hours were spent surrounded by
loving family. Lindsay is preceded in
death by her father, Leo Graves. She is
survived by her two beautiful children,
-Yukari and Eason Albisani; her mother,
Leora Graves; four siblings, Ruth
(Sam) Cooper, Ernest (Mellie) Graves,
Lloyd (Lina) Graves and Helen
(Clarence) Roman; and her many
loving nieces and nephews. Lindsay
was born in Springfield, TN on January
12, 1948, to Leo and Leora Graves. Her
family moved to Tucson in the early
1950's. Lindsay was a bright and
loving child with a great sense of style
who grew into a beautiful,
independent woman full of life and a
love of adventure. Her natural gifts for
science and math assisted in her
graduating from high school with high
marks in just three years in 1965.
Before starting at the University of
Arizona in the Fall of 1965 she
demonstrated a fondness for
adventure and travel by going on an
extended trip to Russia. She earned a
B.A. and a Masters Degree in Science
Education and another Masters
Degree in Special Education. The mid
1970's were occupied with teaching at
Rincon High School before her urge for
adventure led to a teaching position in

Isfahan, Iran. After an escape, requiring that she leave her car and other possessions behind, during the fall of the Shah of Iran, she went to Egypt and taught for a year at the American University of Cairo. Upon her return to Tucson she earned another Masters, this one in Management Information Systems. In the ensuing years she explored Thailand, Spain, Indonesia, and Italy. She married Rocco Albisani in 1984 and moved to Nagoya, Japan where she took up teaching once again. she gave birth to her daughter, Yukari, in March of 1985. The family traveled throughout China that summer before returning home to Tucson. Lindsay gave birth to her son, Eason in January 1987. She enjoyed varied and interesting work, including her four years with the U of A Extended University in the early 1990's before leaving to create a successful computer networking company with her close friend, Dan Meyer. She continued to travel as often as possible to Italy, Africa, Mexico and throughout the United States. During the course of her life whe was generous in both spirit and finances to family and friends alike even funding scholarships for acquaintances who were in need. The smart, engaging, and kind soul will be lovingly remembered by those many lives graced by her touch.
