Laura was married to her soul mate, Cy, for 51 years until his death in June 2006. Laura was a vibrant and compassionate person who was genuine, honest and truthful every minute of her life. She is survived by her sister, Charlotte; children, Barbara and Lois; son-in-law, Gregg; precious granddaughter, Rachel and special family friend, David.
