85, died in his sleep on July 12, 2007. He was born in Lewiston, New York, in 1922, and grew up in Buffalo. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps for 23 years, fought in World War II and Korea, and achieved the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. In the meantime, he graduated from the University of Buffalo and earned a law degree at George Washington University. After retiring from the Marine Corps, he had a second career as a stock broker. In 1970, he moved to Tucson and soon became the manager of the A.G. Edwards and Sons branch office here. A lifetime member of the Tucson Breakfast Lions Club, he continued and expanded his volunteer work after retirement, working with many organizations, including the University of Arizona Ophthalmology Department and Goodwill Industries. He had an equally fulfilling personal life. In 1947, he married Virginia Stutzman, to whom he was happily married for 47 years until her death in early 1995. Together they raised two children, a son and a daughter and celebrated the birth of five grandchildren. After Virginia's death, he was married to Wanda Payne for seven years until her death in 2003. He traveled widely, competed in ballroom dancing, and lived a full life. He leaves behind his children, grandchildren and a multitude of relatives and friends who loved him dearly.
