82, died of natural causes
Sunday February 13, 2011 after
receiving holy communion at her
Armory Park Home. The well
known restaurateur, owner of
Lerua's and El Torero Mexican
restaurants, was born in St.
Mary's Hospital in Tucson, April
19, 1928 to Petra and Estevan
Borgaro. Her unusual pedigree
was always a source of pride:
Mexican, Italian and Yaqui. As a
child she was a favorite of the
sisters at St. Joseph's Carondolet
Academy and helped her father
run Borgaro's Curios downtown
on Congress St. in the late
thirties. She earned her degree
from the University of Arizona in
1948. Carmen modeled for Iconic
Tucson photographer Ray
Manley for a postcard entitled "A
Spanish Senorita, South of the
Border". The photo, taken at
Hacienda del Sol, read..."posed
in the gateway of her adobe
hacienda, this raven-haired,

Carmen married Russell Bradford Hultquist in 1952 and the couple ran the Hultquist Sky Resort in Minong, Wisconsin for many years, returning to Tucson during winter months. Carmen became one of the first female business owners in Tucson when she purchased Lerua's in 1961. Not content to rest on laurels, she established the restaurant's catering operation and opened a second Lerua's on University Blvd. She embodied the unique southwest elegance of Tucson' outfitted by Cele Peterson and coiffed by Willy of Willy's Salon, Carmen was generous, funny, firm and 'fair. Generations of Tucson families came to know, respect and love Carmen as she was a constant fixture at Lerua's for more than 40 year's. The women who worked for Carmen became her daughters, the men, her sons'. her sons'.

Iifelong member of St.
Augustine's Parish, Carmen was
also a member of various historic
organizations. Preceded in death
by husband, Russell Bradford
Hultquist and sister, Adelina
Borgaro. Beloved mother to
