- 1. All persons named BENT (37) in Pennsylvania in 1850. There is 1 Charles b: 1814, Germany, 3 John Bents of which two are of an age to be the father. Both are shown as born in Ireland: One is a shoemaker, the other a boot maker. There are 43 John BENTS in the US of which, none are born in Scotland: There are 11 Eliza YEAGERS, but no sign of Charles. There are 6 Charles BENTS (2 Charles E.) in the US with birthdates near 1845 but none are born in Pennsylvania. All are living with parents.
- 2. Same search was performed in the 1860 US census.

John is a helper on the railroad: Also living at the same address in the 1930 US Census is a Mexican family, Benigno ARGON, wife, Leora, and son Daniel. Benigno is a 65 year old laborer.

According to grandson, Frank MCELHOES, Margarita was disowned by her family for marrying a gringo and she never returned to Hermosillo.

CHARLES BENT, 49 YEARS HERE, DIES TUESDAY

Charles Bent, a well known local mining man, died at the age of 76, died at his residence at 540 South Stone avenue last night, having resided in Tucson for 49 years.

Mr. Bent had been a ____ degree Mason for a number of years, and leaves a host of friends in that organization and among the citizens of Arizona.

His death was directly caused by a stroke of paralysis, although he had been in ill health for two years due to an operation. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Margaret Bent. And one son, Charles E. Bent of Tucson, and seven daughters, Mrs. C. K. Nelson, Mrs. Otto Manke, and Miss Annie Bent of Los Angeles, Mrs. Howard Remley of Calexico, Calif., and Mrs. F. G. Smith, Miss Katie Bent and Miss Adele Bent, residents of Tucson.

Mr. Bent was prominent in mining affairs in this section a decade ago. He was the original developer of the tungsten and gold claims in Pima county.

In the 1920 US census, Howard and Margaret are living in El Paso, El Paso, Texas where Howard is working as an "emigration inspector". In the 1930 US census Howard and Margaret are living in Tucson and Howard is a letter carrier for the post office. There are significant differences between the WWI draft registration completed by Howard and the Death Certificate completed by Margaret, date of birth, middle name, etc. We have used the information from Howard.

According to nephew, Frank MCELHOES, Maggie inherited the Tucson house at the death of her mother. As of 2006, the house reportedly belongs to the Jewish synagogue located next door and is known within the neighborhood as the "Carrillo House".
