According to His Family Bible of Eduard & Marie Heyman his name was Eduard, Ambrosius, Emanuel Heyman, born in Silesia (Prussia) January the 1th, 1852. This was written in his own handwriting and it was signed Ed Heyman on March 11, 1929 in the Eduard Heyman Family Bible. He also wrote a note that his last name was spelled - Heyman (not Heymann) to be pronounced "He-man" which was kept with the Bible.

He held a Decoration from the German Government for services rendered as an interpreter during the France-Prussian War.

Have note written by my mother, Peg S. Davison, that he arrived by boat from Germany in landing in Philadelphia but appears that he actually arrived in Baltimore, Md. and born in 1851.

Ship documentation states that Ambrosius Emanuel Edward Heyman - Passenger #102 arrived 8/18/1882 in Baltimore, Maryland, aboard the SS Koln. This information regarding the SS Koln passage was found at the Salt Lake City, Utah Mormon LDS library by Wilbur Heymann of Salt Lake area (formerly of Milltown, NJ) in the late 1990s or early 2000 timeframe.

Wilbur Heymann (grandson of Ed & Marie Heyman & son of Eduard & Carrie Heymann) has sent me papers that he acquired Citizenship Papers #2486 begun on January 2, 1891 and finalized on July 18, 1899 for A. E. Edward Heyman. They were processed by the Baltimore City Court in the Eighth Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland so that he could become a Citizen of the United States and Renouncing Germany. John Beckney from Jamesburg, NJ signed Citizenship papers as someone who knew him for over 5 yrs. and A. E. Ed Heyman also shows up on 1910 Census of Monroe Twp., Middlesex Co., NJ living on Possum Hollow Rd, Dwelling # 162, Jamesburg.

Known by neighbors and friends as "Edward" or "Ed".

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Edward was beaten by boys and robbed of his money while going door to door selling Gideon Bibles and lost an eye from the beating. He wore a glass eye and Aunt Florence remembers, as a little girl, that he shattered his glass eye by hitting into a phonograph player without the horn on it and hit his eye area just right and it shattered. They had quite a time getting all the glass out of the eye socket.

He lost right hand (severed to wrist) due to a thrashing machine/farm accident at the F.P. Tantum farm in Dayton, NJ, Aug. 25, 1919. "Newspaper article in my Genealogy loose leaf notebook". He actually lost his arm to his elbow (information from his grandchildren) due to this accident! He also suffered from mental distress due to the farm accident and disappearance of daughter, Julia, according to news clippings.

He is buried at Fernwood Cemetery in Jamesburg, NJ and the marker says Edward A. Heymann, Sr. - (grave site # 433 is located in back far end - second road out on hill) (Internment # 1428) along side of wife Mary Deuschle ( She was referred to as Marie "the Dutch Grandma" by my Grandma Helen Anna Heyman Stults).

Heyman's granddaughters. I (Doris Davison Parry - Margaret Stults Davison's daughter) have one and Florence Elizabeth Stults Van Treuren (my aunt) has the other.

Helena "Anna" Heyman Stults was a very hard worker. Anna was a farmer daughter and wife and worked out in the fields more than Grandpa because he held other jobs. She never held a driver's license but could drive any machinery on the farm. She and her husband, Harold rented cabins to State men as a side income, raised their own cows, pigs, chickens, guinea hens, and other livestock during the years. They also raised bees for honey.

During World War II, she would make butter & pot cheese from the milk she would take from the cows on the small farm. She would sell the milk, butter, pot cheese and eggs from the farm to make ends meet when money was short. Occasionally, she would do things like cross stitch, knit and crochet doilies, rag rugs, quilts and other hand work during the long winter months or evenings along with her mother-in-law, Mary Luella Stults. She was a very good fixer-upper for my dolls or blankets that would be in disrepair. Grandma, Anna Stults, would even fix my daughter's (her great granddaughters) dolls when something would happen to them and they were in need of repair. She knew how to make do with whatever she had.

She was a very kind hearted person and if anyone needed help or assistance she was there for them. Anna had a kind heart towards animals also. They always had a dog and sometimes more than one. They had a green parrot that she saved from certain death. A merchant marine owned the bird and would abuse it when he would come home from one of his binges. She asked him one day if he would like her to take Polly off his hands and he gladly gave Polly to her. She was about the only one who could handle him without being bitten. She had him doing tricks and everything. When she would clean his cage, she would put him on an ice cream parlor chair and he would sit there until Grandma would be ready to put him back in his clean cage. If she told him to go down and around, Polly would go down through the round circles in the back of the chair. He would call her by name saying "Anna" and he would also call Grandpa by saying "Harold". He was intelligent and Grandma got him to do many things and call us by name. Sometimes you couldn't tell if it was him or one of us humans calling the person.

Grandma would work out in the fields with crops like any man would have done and still complete indoor chores too.

According to His Family Bible of Eduard & Marie Heyman his name was Eduard, Ambrosius, Emanuel Heyman, born in Silesia (Prussia) January the 1th, 1852. This was written in his own handwriting and it was signed Ed Heyman on March 11, 1929 in the Eduard Heyman Family Bible. He also wrote a note that his last name was spelled - Heyman (not Heymann) to be pronounced "He-man" which was kept with the Bible.

He held a Decoration from the German Government for services rendered as an interpreter during the France-Prussian War.

Have note written by my mother, Peg S. Davison, that he arrived by boat from Germany in landing in Philadelphia but appears that he actually arrived in Baltimore, Md. and born in 1851.

Ship documentation states that Ambrosius Emanuel Edward Heyman - Passenger #102 arrived 8/18/1882 in Baltimore, Maryland, aboard the SS Koln. This information regarding the SS Koln passage was found at the Salt Lake City, Utah Mormon LDS library by Wilbur Heymann of Salt Lake area (formerly of Milltown, NJ) in the late 1990s or early 2000 timeframe.

Wilbur Heymann (grandson of Ed & Marie Heyman & son of Eduard & Carrie Heymann) has sent me papers that he acquired Citizenship Papers #2486 begun on January 2, 1891 and finalized on July 18, 1899 for A. E. Edward Heyman. They were processed by the Baltimore City Court in the Eighth Judicial Circuit of the State of Maryland so that he could become a Citizen of the United States and Renouncing Germany. John Beckney from Jamesburg, NJ signed Citizenship papers as someone who knew him for over 5 yrs. and A. E. Ed Heyman also shows up on 1910 Census of Monroe Twp., Middlesex Co., NJ living on Possum Hollow Rd, Dwelling # 162, Jamesburg.

Known by neighbors and friends as "Edward" or "Ed".

Edward was beaten by boys and robbed of his money while going door to door selling Gideon Bibles and lost an eye from the beating. He wore a glass eye and Aunt Florence remembers, as a little girl, that he shattered his glass eye by hitting into a phonograph player without the horn on it and hit his eye area just right and it shattered. They had quite a time getting all the glass out of the eye socket.

He lost right hand (severed to wrist) due to a thrashing machine/farm accident at the F.P. Tantum farm in Dayton, NJ, Aug. 25, 1919. "Newspaper article in my Genealogy loose leaf notebook". He actually lost his arm to his elbow (information from his grandchildren) due to this accident! He also suffered from mental distress due to the farm accident and disappearance of daughter, Julia, according to news clippings.

He is buried at Fernwood Cemetery in Jamesburg, NJ and the marker says Edward A. Heymann, Sr. - (grave site # 433 is located in back far end - second road out on hill) (Internment # 1428) along side of wife Mary Deuschle ( She was referred to as Marie "the Dutch Grandma" by my Grandma Helen Anna Heyman Stults).

Sterling/Black pendant with inlay of pearl Dove came from a button that Grandma Heyman brought from Germany and made into a pendant. There are two in existence. The pendants were given to Marie D. Heyman's granddaughters. I (Doris Davison Parry - Margaret Stults Davison's daughter) have one and Florence Elizabeth Stults Van Treuren (my aunt) has the other.

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Doris D Parry inherited Margaret's pendant when Margaret passed away in 1993. Doris will be giving this pendant to Luanne J. Ryan North to be given to her daughter, April M. Barry.

Florence's pendant was given to Holly A Ryan Keough in fall of 2002 by Florence E. Stults Van Treuren.

Helena "Anna" Heyman Stults was a very hard worker. Anna was a farmer daughter and wife and worked out in the fields more than Grandpa because he held other jobs. She never held a driver's license but could drive any machinery on the farm. She and her husband, Harold rented cabins to State men as a side income, raised their own cows, pigs, chickens, guinea hens, and other livestock during the years. They also raised bees for honey.

During World War II, she would make butter & pot cheese from the milk she would take from the cows on the small farm. She would sell the milk, butter, pot cheese and eggs from the farm to make ends meet when money was short. Occasionally, she would do things like cross stitch, knit and crochet doilies, rag rugs, quilts and other hand work during the long winter months or evenings along with her mother-in-law, Mary Luella Stults. She was a very good fixer-upper for my dolls or blankets that would be in disrepair. Grandma, Anna Stults, would even fix my daughter's (her great granddaughters) dolls when something would happen to them and they were in need of repair. She knew how to make do with whatever she had.

She was a very kind hearted person and if anyone needed help or assistance she was there for them.

Anna had a kind heart towards animals also. They always had a dog and sometimes more than one. They had a green parrot that she saved from certain death. A merchant marine owned the bird and would abuse it when he would come home from one of his binges. She asked him one day if he would like her to take Polly off his hands and he gladly gave Polly to her. She was about the only one who could handle him without being bitten. She had him doing tricks and everything. When she would clean his cage, she would put him

on an ice cream parlor chair and he would sit there until Grandma would be ready to put him back in his clean cage. If she told him to go down and around, Polly would go down through the round circles in the back of the chair. He would call her by name saying "Anna" and he would also call Grandpa by saying "Harold". He was intelligent and Grandma got him to do many things and call us by name. Sometimes you couldn't tell if it was him or one of us humans calling the person.

Grandma would work out in the fields with crops like any man would have done and still complete indoor chores too.

Grandpa & Grandma always had a car and in later years it was always a Willy's which could be used for travel but also for farm use. They always had chickens, ducks, pigs and a cow or two on the farm which provided them with eggs, milk, butter and meat for the table. I don't remember bread being made at home but it could have been but that I was too young to remember. They would usually buy their bread and pound cake from the A&P or Acme store. I remember helping my Great Grandma & Grandma make butter to sell for a little more income or they would exchange for some other food for it. They didn't have electric to make the butter so we would hand churn the butter. We would color the butter with a orange colored capsule of food dye in later years otherwise it was very bland color.

Grandma & Grandpa lived on the Main St. of Milltown while their daughters were in their teen years. The girls talked about roller skating while they lived there. Then they lived on Georges Road, New Brunswick for a number of years before moving back on the Henry A Stults farm on Dayton-Fresh Pond Road, Dayton (now known as So. Brunswick). They moved back to the farm to be with Grandpa's ailing mother, Mary L Beekman Stults. They built a barn/house on the opposite side of the road from Great Grandma's home

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and they set up housekeeping in a small AirStream trailer on top of the hill for a few years and then replaced it with a regular house trailer. They didn't live in it at all times because of Great Grandma's health and they would take turns sleeping down at the house.
