# Obituary

Mrs. Mollie Lee Parker Bridges, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Genie Parker, departed this life on July 4, 1993.

She was born in the town of Reagan, Texas.

She attended school in Reagan and Moore High School in Waco, Texas.

She was united in holy matrimony to Mr. F. L. Bridges on February 3, 1924. He preceded her in death.
