Obituary

Rosie Lee (Clay) Jones was born March 27, 1917 in Falls County, Reagan, Texas, the third of six children.

She professed a hope in Christ at an early age and joined Bethany Baptist Church, Highbank, Texas, and later the Zion Rock Baptist Church, where she served faithfully on the Usher Board and was an active participant in all activities of the church. She united with Zion Hill Baptist Church, Marlin, October 9, 1983, because it was closer to home. She worked faithfully in Zion Hill until her illness, January 6, 1986, serving in the Mission Society, Sunday School and other departments.
