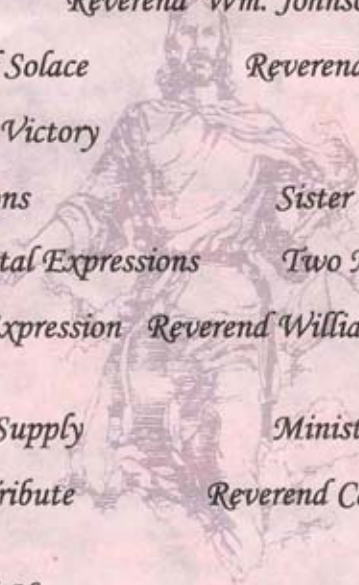
Beulah attended school in Falls County. She later met, fell in love and married Mr. Eligha Woodson. God blessed this loving union with twelve children.
