This volume shows how a growing North Texas town invested its resources—and its heart—in one stunning high school, and then in another. The Educational Institute, built in 1874, was the first free, graded school in Texas. The stunning Mission-style Denison High School replaced it in 1914.

Two Schools traces the evolution of Denison's educational system from frontier days through the era of racial desegregation, when the high school served as McDaniel Junior High. It finally closed in May 1986.

Efforts to preserve and reuse the historic structure culminated in 2007, as opposing factions waged a dramatic struggle to determine the fate of the school—and the future character of their community.

Individual photos of the DHS Classes of 1911–1954, moving personal accounts, and full indexes make it easy to find your ancestors. With its wealth of illustrations, this book is an indispensable resource for genealogists, educators, preservationists, and lovers of Texas history.
