Obituary

Classie Davis was born in Groveton, Texas to Gertrude Turner and Jeff Davis in 1919.

Classie Davis moved to Baytown in 1931 at the age of twelve years old. She attended George Washington Carver High School and graduated in 1937. She married Adel Reed of Centerville, Texas in 1938. He preceded her in death in 1968.

Classie enrolled and graduated from Lee College's Vocational Education Program for Nurse's Aide certification. She worked as a nurse's aide for seventeen years at San Jacinto Methodist Hospital in Baytown, Texas where she was highly thought of by her colleagues and her patients.

Classie was a member of Thompson Chapel C.M.E. Church for over fifty years. Besides serving in the capacity as President of the Senior Choir, she also served as a teacher and officer in the Sunday School.

Classie was very active in Baytown and the Oakwood Community. She was active in the Girl Scouts of America, serving as a troop leader for a number of years. She was a notary public. She served as President of the Garden Club. She was a civil rights activist, helping to integrate the Goose Creek Consolidated Independent School District. She also served in the capacity of president of the Senior Choir for a number of years at Thompson Chapel.

She is survived by her brother and sister-in-law: Walter Lee and Lois L. King, Baytown; one niece: Classie King Moore, Baytown; two nephews: Vernon D. King, Baytown, and Charles L. King, Nacogdoches, and a host of great nieces and nephews.
