A native of Jasper, Texas, Clydie Young was born October 23, 1911 to Robert Lee and Laurilla Gibson. She attended the public school of Pine-land, Texas. She met and married Griffin Roberts. This union was blessed with one son, J.C. She later moved to Groveton, Texas where she met and married Jason Young. To this union two girls were born, Alice Marie and Emma Lee.

She accepted Christ at an early age. She joined Rose Hill Baptist Church, Groveton, Texas, during her early years where she sang in the choir. She later moved her membership to Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Jossierand, Texas, under the pastorage of Rev. H. Dolphus and Rev. J.T. Groves.

She moved to Santa Ana, California in 1955 where she united with Second Baptist Church, 1915 McFadden Ave., Santa Ana, California, under the pastorage of Rev. I.N. Whitten, Rev. S.Z. Henderson, Rev. Richard Kesse and present pastor Rev. John N. McReynolds. She was a faithful member and was lovingly called "Mama Clydie" by the entire congrega-tion. She was a member of the Executive Choir, Deaconess Board, Chair-woman of the Kitchen Committee.

She was an active member of the Educational Extension Club of Orange County where she served as President and Treasurer. After the loss of her husband in 1987 she moved to Sacramento, California where she united with Shiloh Baptist Church, Rev. W.P. Cook, Pastor Emeritus, and Rev. Clifford Cheathon. She served faithfully on the Mother's Board.

In 1991 she moved to Waco, Texas for a short period of time where she joined First Baptist Church under the pastorage of Rev. George R. Harrison. She returned to Groveton in 1992 (the place she loved) and re-united with Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Jossierand, Texas under the Pastorage of Rev. Nathaniel Jenkins where she served faithfully as a member of the choir until her demise.
