#### **OBITUARY**

Maggie Johnson, Lewis, 76 year old retired School District Employee, devout Christian worker, dedicated community service volunteer, widow of the late Thelman A. Lewis and a Fort Worth resident for almost a half century, entered into eternal rest on Tuesday, November 18, 1986. Her demise came at a local hospital just a year and three months after the death of her husband.

Maggie was born February 25, 1910 to the parentage of the late Monroe Johnson and Lizzie Hill Johnson at Nacogdoches, Texas. She grew up there and at nearby Lufkin where her parents moved during her early Childhood. She attended Public School in Nacogdoches and in Lufkin, and united with Lufkin's Long Chapel C.M.E. Church at an early age.

In 1938, Maggie was married to Thelman Atlas Lewis, and the couple remained husband and wife for 48 years until his demise July 27, 1984 here in Fort Worth, Texas.

The couple moved to Fort Worth during the early 1930s and settled. Here Mrs. Lewis served in the households of several prominent families, among them the Bloomingdale and the Nell Ligon Families. She also served as a food service employee for the Fort Worth Independent School District for over a decade before retiring in 1978.

Mrs. Lewis was a long time member of historic Saint Andrews United Methodist Church, where she served with the "'Methodist Women United''. She is well remembered for her efforts and undaunting support of the Ministers. An enthusiastic Bible scholar, Mrs. Lewis, was a regular attendant and participant at the "Saturday Morning Bible Study" at Saint Andrews.

She was a member of the Maddox Community Center Senior Citizens Organization, and served in the Volunteer Program at the Center.

She is survived by her five sisters, Mmes. Cassie Mae Mark, Dannie Mark, Bessie Lee and Nettie Mae Johnson all of Apple Springs, Texas, and Mrs. Martha N. Menefee of Nacogdoches, Texas. Five step-grandchildren, Pippa Dempsy, Corey Lewis, Pamela Lewis, Brandon Lewis and Phillippa Lewis, several generations of other relatives and a multitude of friends.
