BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Dilley Andrew McCoy, the eldest of six children of Andrew and Mattie Ellis McCoy, was born February 16, 1904, in Palestine, Anderson County, Texas.

The product of Christian parents, he confessed Christ at an early age and joined the Pilgrim Rest Baptist Church, where he involved himself in its many religious activities. In public school, he often excelled in literary activities and contests. He graduated from Lincoln High School in 1923.

One daughter was born of a brief first marriage.

His employment as a brakeman for Southern Pacific Railroad necessitated his moving from Houston to Lufkin in 1937. On April 2, 1940, he was married to Miss Maggie Carter, and this loving relationship endured for almost 47 years.

Choosing to serve in the same religious environment as that of his wife, he became a member of Long Chapel C.M.E. Church. Elevated to a position as steward, he performed his duties faithfully and with dedication. In almost every financial effort of the church he was a zealous and enthusiastic solicitor and liberal supporter.

Fraternal affiliation included membership in Dawn of Light No. 79, F, and A.M.

He retired as a brakeman in the early seventies.

His illness of several months became critical, and he was again hospitalized on Monday, January 26, 1987.

As he had lived, quietly and without ostentation, on January 31, 1987, he embraced the blessed peace and eternal rest which is Death.

Survivors include a devoted wife, Mrs. Maggie McCoy; one daughter, Mrs. Miriam Louise Alexander of San Diego, California; two brothers, Hansel D. McCoy of Houston, Texas, and Edward McCoy, Sr. of Palestine, Texas; one sister, Mrs. Verniece M. Scales of Palestine, Texas; two grandsons, Dilley Frank and Milton Alexander of San Diego, California; seven great-grandchildren and many relatives and friends.
