Remembering Milton James Oliver

It was May 26, 1923 when Milton James Oliver made his debut. A bouncing baby boy entrusted to the parentage of George and Estella Oliver in Somerville, Texas. Milton grew up in Somerville, Texas where he received his education. He served in the United States Army in World War II and was later honorably discharged. He then returned home and attended Prairie View A&M University where he received his teaching degree in electronics.
