He served two tours in Vietnam during which time he flew 100+ missions in the F105. He was shotdown, escaped capture and was rescued by the Jolly Greens. He received the Distinguish Flying Cross, Air Medal with six oak leaf clusters, Purple Heart and the Commendation Medal. After retiring he worked in the travel business and he and Annette enjoyed traveling the world.

He is preceded in death by his son, Gregory Scott. He is survived by his wife, Annette; sister, Ann Hawkins (Joseph); a daughter, Denise Swords (Scott); sons, Robert, Jr. (Connie) and Stephan; stepsons, Christopher (Christine) and Craig (Kelly); 18 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
