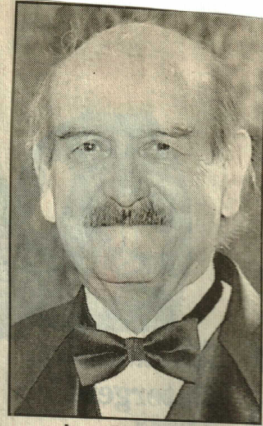

James E. Harrington

born October 3, 1937 in Dodge City, Kansas, passed away in Tucson on July 9, 2007. Jim spent his childhood between Tucson and Topeka and eventually settled down in Tucson after serving on the USS Grampus submarine. Jim earned his degree in architecture at the University of Arizona. He worked for the architectural firm CNWC in the beginning of his career, but realized his dream of owning his own business in 1980 when he opened Harrington & Associates, Architects. Jim thoroughly enjoyed architecture and tended to focus on medical facilities, including countless new structures and additions at UMC and TMC, as well as many Indian Health Service facilities. Jim was also a member of the Potawatomi Prairie Band Indian tribe located in Mayetta, Kansas. Jim is survived by Katie, his wife of over 30 years; his three sons, Michael, Patrick and Timothy; daughter, Elizabeth; brother, Tom; sisters, Susie and Sharon and stepmother, Marmee. Jim was a wonderful husband, father and friend. He was greatly loved and will be greatly missed. The memorial service will be held at the San Pedro Chapel, 5230 E.
