Walter W. Deal, 74, founder of the Washington funeral home which bears his name, died yesterday at 7702 Old Chester road, Bethesda, the home of his daughter, Mrs. Clifton G. Hall. He had lived with his daughter for the last 13 months. Mr. Deal had suffered from a heart ailment for several years.

A native of Baltimore, he was the son of the late John F. and Mary Ann Deal. He began the study of medicine at Johns Hopkins University, but later transferred to a morticians'

school in that city. He came to Washington in 1908 and established his funeral home at 816 H street N.E. the

same year. In 1937 he built the present funeral home, located at 4812 Argyle Country Club in Layhill, of th lishment until 1952.


