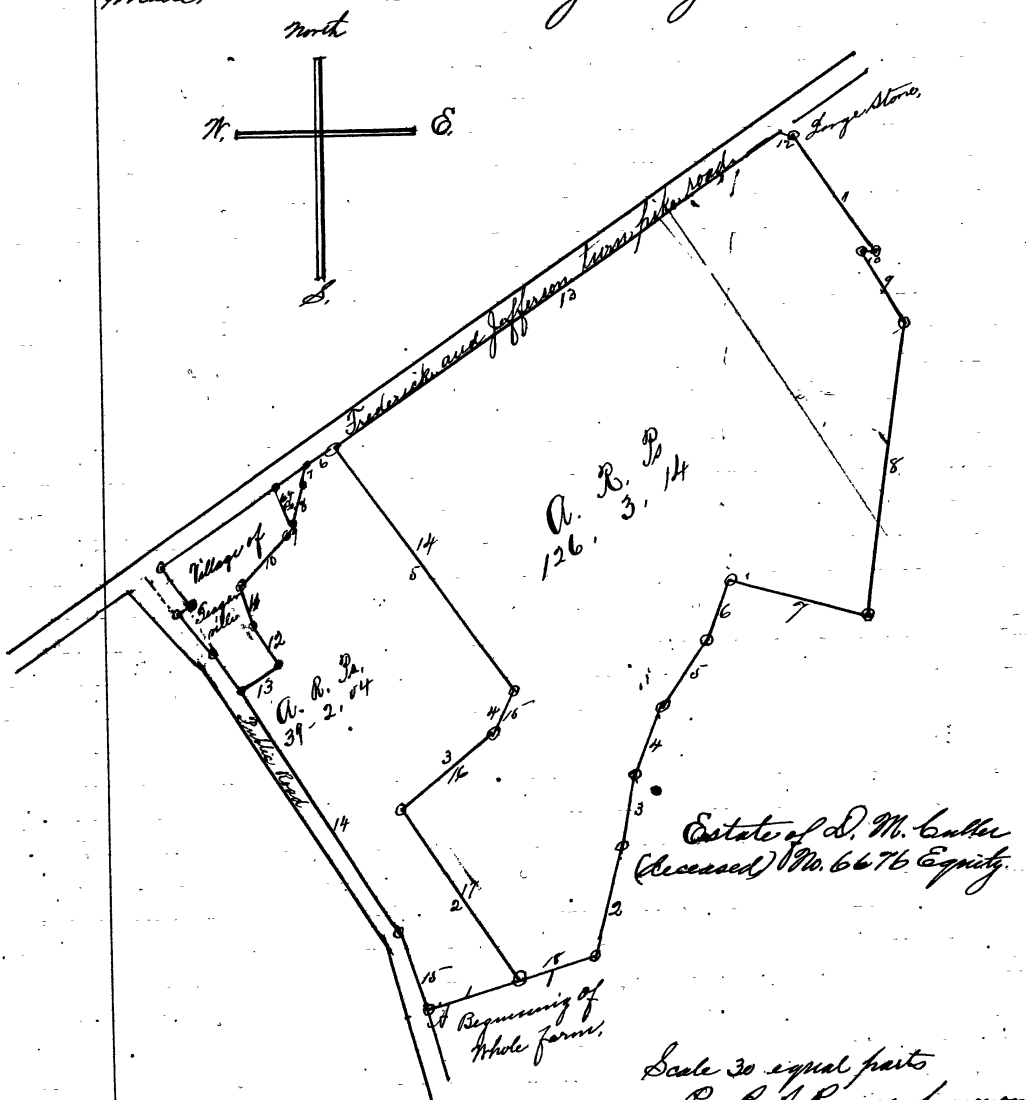

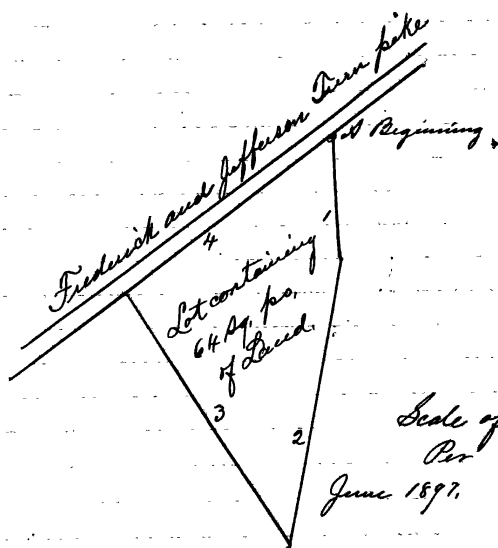

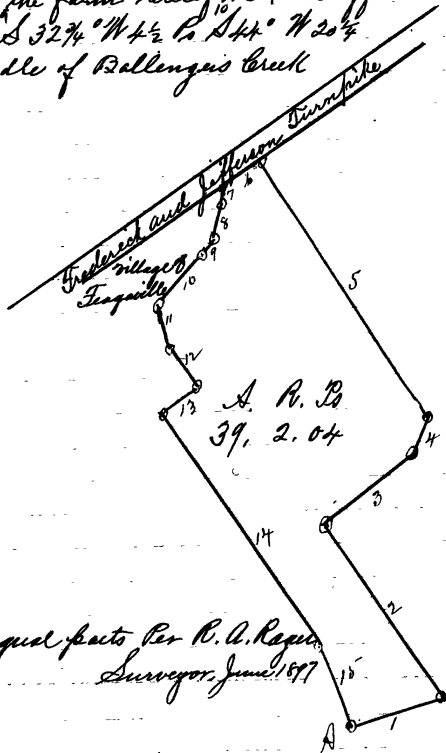


Scale of 4 equal parts
