

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HISTORICAL SKETCH AND ROSTER OF COMMISSIONED OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN OF THE DRAFTFD MILITIA OF MAINE, CALLED INTO ACTUAL SERVICE FOR THE PROTECTION OF ITS NORTHEASTERN FRONTIER, FROM FEBRUARY TO MAY, 1839.

THE AROOSTOOK WAR, 1839.

Among the many important events in the early history of the State of Maine one of much interest is that known as the Aroostook War, a brief sketch of which is given below.

By the treaty of 1783, at the close of the Revolutionary struggle, one-half of the St. John's river belonged to Maine. After the war of 1812, the British claimed the whole of the upper part of the vast valley of the St. John. They demanded all the land above the forty-sixth degree of north latitude, which included about one-third of what was supposed to be the territory of Maine. There was at this time, on the north or eastern side of the river, an American settlement * * * extending for a distance of nearly twenty miles. The inhabitants were principally of French descent, and had emigrated to that American region when the English took possession of Arcadia. This plantation had been incorporated as the town of Madawaska, and a representative was sent to the legislature of Maine. In June, 1837, Congress sent an officer to Madawaska to take a census of the people, and at the same time to distribute the surplus money which had accumulated in the United States treasury. A British constable arrested this agent and carried his prisoner to the nearest English shire town. the sheriff there, alarmed, refused to receive the prisoner, and he returned to Madawaska, and continued to prosecute his mission.

Governor Harvey of New Brunswick, hearing of the distribution of money to the people, assumed that it was a bribe to induce the inhabitants to continue their allegiance to the United States. He therefore ordered the agent to be re-arrested and he was lodged in Frederickton jail. Governor Dunlap, at that time governor of Maine, issued a general order announcing that the soil of our State had been invaded by a foreign power. The militia were therefore called upon to hold themselves in readiness for active service. A few weeks after, the British authorities set the imprisoned agent at liberty. Both parties wisely decided to refer the question to arbitration.

By the convention between the United States and Great Britain, at London, September 29, 1827, it was agreed through the plenipotentiaries of the two powers, that points of difference between the commissioners appointed according to the fifth article of the treaty of Ghent, should be referred to some friendly sovereign or state. They finally made a choice of William, King of Netherlands, as arbiter of questions submitted under that treaty.

The question in regard to the northeastern boundary being referred to him, he decided that the line should run about half-way between the boundaries claimed by the two powers.

The question submitted was "Which of the two boundaries is the one authorized by the treaty?" and he decided in favor of a line which the treaty did not indicate, and of which neither of the parties had thought. The people of Maine were indignant at this decision. The national government, anxious to avoid war, generously offered Maine a million acres of land in Michigan, in exchange for the territory she would thus lose. This offer was declined, and prolonged negotiations ensued. During the years from 1832, when the decision was waived by both the interested parties, until 1842, when Maine assented to a compromise, there had been frequent collisions on the frontier. In 1838, Governor Kent took measures to increase the efficiency of the militia, and General Wool was sent to inspect the fortifications on the Penobscot, the St. Croix and the Kennebec. The line which Maine claimed by the treaty of 1783 was again surveyed. The territory thus in dispute became the prey of plunderers. Soon there was a conflict between the British lumbermen and American officers.

Governor Harvey of New Brunswick issued a proclamation declaring that British territory had been invaded and ordering out a thousand of the militia. Affairs now began to look Immediately fifty volunteers set out from Augusta for the scene of action. At the same time Governor Harvey sent a communication to the governor of Maine, at Augusta, demanding the recall of the American troops from the Aroostook, announcing that he was instructed by the British government to hold exclusive charge over the disputed territory and that he should do so by military force. This aroused the indignation of the people of Maine. The legislature passed a resolve for the protection of the public lands, and appropriated eight hundred thousand dollars to that purpose. A draft was also ordered for ten thousand three hundred and forty-three men from the militia to be ready for immediate action. General Bachelder was commander of the western division of militia. Within a week ten thousand American troops were either in Aroostook county, or on the march there. The national government was roused. Congress passed a bill authorizing the President of the United States to raise fifty thousand troops for the support of Maine, and appropriating ten million dollars to meet the expense, should the governor of New Brunswick fulfil his threat of maintaining exclusive jurisdiction over the territory in dispute. On the fifth of March, General Scott with his staff, reached Augusta. He informed the governor that he was "specially charged with maintaining the peace and safety of the entire northern and eastern frontiers." He took quarters at the Augusta House and entered into correspondence with both Governor Harvey of New Brunswick and Governor Fairfield of Maine, endeavoring to act the part of peacemaker.

Governor Harvey pledged himself that, in prospect of the peaceful settlement of the question between the two nations, he would not take military possession of the territory, or endeavor to expel from it the civil posse or the troops of Maine. Governor Fairfield pledged himself that he would not, without renewed instructions, disturb any of the New Brunswick settlements in the Madawaska region. He agreed to withdraw his troops and leave uninterrupted communication between New Brunswick and Canada.

This settlement brought peace. The prisoners on both sides were set at liberty. In March, the Aroostook region, which

had previously formed a portion of Penobscot and Washington counties, was formed into a new county bearing its original name. It was generally supposed that the prompt military preparations we had made, which gave us the command of the situation, had great influence with the British authorities in securing a peaceful settlement. Although the Aroostook war called for troops which were sent to the scene of disturbance, the outbreak was a bloodless one; nevertheless it was the occasion of great annoyance and the expenditure of large sums of money.

In the year 1842 Lord Ashburton came to Washington, the British ambassador authorized to form a new treaty for the settlement of the boundary. An extra session of the legislature of Maine was called. Commissioners were appointed to confer with Lord Ashburton and Secretary Webster upon this subject. The troublesome question was soon settled. England greatly needed a portion of this territory that there might be free communication between New Brunswick and Canada. surrendered a considerable tract which was of but little value. In compensation the United States received a territory of much greater value, on the borders of Lakes Champlain and Superior. The national government paid Maine one hundred and fifty thousand dollars for the surrender. The State also received two hundred thousand dollars as re-imbursement for the expense she had incurred in defending the integrity of American territory. The Senate of the United States ratified the Ashburton treaty August 20, 1842. By this treaty, which is sometimes called from the negotiations the Webster-Ashburton treaty, arrangements were made for the final settlement of boundaries between the different states and the British possessions in North America.

Much interesting matter in regard to this subject is found in "Abbott's History of Maine." The printed volumes of "Resolves of the State of Maine" contain valuable material connected with those years of open controversy. Other works are by Albert Gallatin, "The Right of the United States to the Northeastern Boundary Claimed by Them," (New York, 1840); Chas. S. Daveis "Report of the Committee on the North Eastern Boundary, Legislative Documents, 1841:" William P. Preble "The Decision of the King of Netherlands" published anonymously, (Portland, 1841).

Following are general orders issued in 1839, which relate to the Aroostook War, also a list of officers in active service at that time and the muster rolls of forty-six companies of infantry and artillery which were called into active service.

STATE OF MAINE.

Headquarters, Augusta, February 16, 1839.

General Order, No. 5.

Major General Isaac Hodsdon, third Division, Maine Militia:—You are hereby ordered to detach, forthwith, from the Division under your command, by draft or otherwise one thousand men, properly officered and equipped. This force will rendezvous at Bangor and proceed at the earliest possible moment, to the place occupied by a civil force under the Land Agent on or near the Aroostook river, and render such aid to the Land Agent as may enable him to carry into effect a Resolve of 24th of January, relating to trespassers upon the public lands.

HEADQUARTERS, Augusta, February 17, 1839.

General Order, No. 6.

Major General Hodsdon of the third Division, having been directed by General Orders of the 16th instant, to make a draft of one thousand men from his Division, the detailment will consist of eight hundred and fifty Infantry, Light Infantry and Riflemen, and one hundred and fifty Artillery. The companies will be organized with sixty-four privates, four sergeants, and two musicians. The draft will be required to report themselves to the Major General at Bangor, on Thursday the 21st instant. The Major General will command the detachment in person, and he will detail, in addition to the proper number of Company officers, one Colonel, one Lieutenant Colonel, and one Major of Infantry, and one Major of Artillery, together with the appropriate Staff. General Hodsdon will make immediate requisition by express on the acting Quartermaster General, for such supplies, including military stores, as in his opinion, the nature of the service contemplated may require.

The detachment will be required to appear with the arms and equipments of their respective corps, and with three days' provisions. They will be drafted to serve three months unless sooner discharged.

When the detachment shall have been completed, Major General Hodsdon will forward to the Adjutant General a complete roll of the officers, non-commissioned officers and privates, describing the Brigade, Regiment and Companies from which they were severally taken.

General Hodsdon will procure at Bangor, or at such other place as he may find convenient, the necessary camp equipage for the detachment.

STATE OF MAINE.

Headquarters, Augusta, February 19, 1839.

General Order, No. 7.

The Commander-in-Chief directs a detachment of ten thousand three hundred and forty-three officers, non-commissioned officers and privates, including field and staff officers, to be made by draft from the several Divisions, in the proportions, and from the several corps mentioned in the schedule of detail prepared by the Adjutant General. The officers and soldiers when detached will severally hold themselves in readiness for an immediate call into the service of the State, armed and equipped as required by law.

The Major Generals and officers commanding Divisions are directed to cause the draft aforesaid, to be made with all possible expedition, and complete rolls of both officers and men, designating the Companies, Regiments and Brigades from which they are taken, to be immediately forwarded to the office of the Adjutant General.

In making this call upon a portion of the military force, to hold itself in readiness for active service, the Commander-in-Chief would remind the whole body of the militia, of the important position they occupy as citizen soldiers; and should the contingency unfortunately occur, when their services should be required to render protection to our citizens, or preserve the honor of our State, he will rely with entire confidence on their patriotism for such aid as the exigency may require.

General Order, No. 10.

Brigadier General George W. Bachelder, of the first Brigade of the second Division, will forthwith repair to Headquarters and report himself to the Adjutant General, and wait orders for special duty.

The detachment made from the first Brigade of the second Division, pursuant to General Order number seven of February 19, 1839, excepting Cavalry, is ordered into the service of the State. The detachment will be forthwith organized into Companies, consisting as nearly as may be, of sixty-four privates, four sergeants and two musicians, and will assemble at the Court House in Augusta on Monday the twenty-fifth day of February, instant, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, with the arms and equipments of their respective corps, including knapsacks and blankets, required by law for actual service. Each man will furnish himself with three days' provisions; and officers commanding Regiments will forthwith notify the selectmen of towns, to cause the detachment from their respective towns to be attended on their march with suitable carriages, provisions, camp equipage and camp utensils, until notice shall be given them by the commanding officers to desist.

Upon the arrival of the several Companies at Augusta, each commanding officer thereof will report himself to Brigadier General Bachelder, together with the state of his Company.

The field and staff officers of the detachment will also report themselves to Brigadier General Bachelder at the time appointed.

The detachment aforesaid will serve for the term of three months, unless sooner discharged by the Commander-in-Chief.

Major General White will detail one Brigade Major, one Aid de Camp to Brigadier General and one Brigade Quartermaster, for the staff of Brigadier General Bachelder, and the officers detailed will be required to report themselves to him at Augusta, at the time appointed for the rendezyous of the detachment.

STATE OF MAINE.

HEADQUARTERS, Augusta, February 22, 1839.

General Order, No. 11.

Major General Ezekiel Foster of the seventh Division, will order into the service of the State, from that portion of his Division directed by General Order number seven of February 19, 1839, to be held in readiness for a call, excepting therefrom those residing in the town of Calais, four Captains, four Lieutenants, four Ensigns, sixteen sergeants, eight musicians, and two hundred and fifty-six privates of Infantry; and one Captain, one Lieutenant, one Ensign, four sergeants, two musicians and sixty-four privates of Light Infantry. The detachment will be immediately organized into Companies of sixty-four privates, four sergeants and two musicians, and they will be required to march forthwith to the town of Calais. They will be retained in service three months, unless sooner discharged by the Commander-in-Chief.

The necessary orders will be given for the troops to provide themselves with arms and equipment complete for active service, and three days' rations, and also for the commanding officers of Regiments to give notice to the selectmen to provide suitable carriages, provisions, camp equipage and camp utensils, while on the march, until notified to desist.

Major General Foster will himself proceed to Calais in due season, with two members of his staff, and take immediate command of the troops ordered out.

General Foster will make immediate requisition on the acting Quarter-master General, for such supplies, including military stores, as he may deem necessary—which requisition will be presented to Captain Randall Whidden of Calais, and Captain of the Calais Artillery, who will take immediate measures to answer the call. He will also forward complete rolls of both officers and men, designating the Companies, Regiments and Brigades from which they were taken, to the office of the Adjutant General.

General Order, No. 12.

The Commander-in-Chief directs that there be immediately called into the service of the State, by detail and draft, from the detachment made pursuant to General Order, No. 7, of February 19, 1839, the following officers, non-commissioned officers and privates, viz:—

From the Fourth Division, one Quartermaster and one Paymaster of Artillery; from the Fifth Division, two Captains, two Lieutenants, two Ensigns eight Sergeants, two Drummers two Fifers, and one hundred and twenty-eight privates of Light Infantry; one Captain, one Lieutenant, one Ensign, four Sergeants, one Drummer, one Fifer, and sixty-four privates of Riflemen; from the Sixth Division, one Lieutenant Colonel, one Major, one Adjutant, one Quartermaster, one Paymaster, one Chaplain, one Surgeon, one Surgeon's mate, one Sergeant Major, one Quartermaster Sergeant, one Drum Major, one Fife Major, four Captains, four Lieuten-

ants, four Ensigns, sixteen Sergeants, four Drummers, four Fifers, and two hundred and fifty-six privates of Infantry; one Captain, one Lieutenant, one Ensign, four Sergeants, one Drummer, one Fifer, and sixty-four privates of Riflemen; and from the Eighth Division, one Lieutenant Colonel, one Major, one Adjutant, one Quartermaster, one Paymaster, one Chaplain, one Surgeon, one Surgeon's mate, one Sergeant Major, one Quartermaster Sergeant, one Drum Major, one Fife Major, four Captains, four Lieutenants, four Ensigns, sixteen Sergeants, four Drummers, four Fifers, and two hundred and fifty-six privates of Infantry; and one Adjutant, one Captain, two Lieutenants, four Sergeants, one Drummer, one Fifer, and sixty-four privates of Artillery. Major Generals will cause this draft to be immediately organized into Companies of four Sergeants, one Drummer, one Fifer, and sixty-four privates, and will cause them to rendezvous as follows:

Those from the Fifth Division, at the Court House in Portland, on Monday the fourth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and they will report themselves to Major General Jewett, who will place them under command of the senior Captain of the draft, with orders to proceed forthwith to Augusta and report his command at Headquarters, to the Adjutant General.

Those from the Sixth Division at the Court House in Augusta, on Wednesday the sixth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and report themselves by commanding officers of Companies to the Adjutant General at Headquarters.

Those from the Eighth Division, at the Inn of Dudley Heywood in Skowhegan, on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and report themselves to Major General Bodfish, who will place them under command of Colonel Nathan Goodridge, with orders to proceed on the road to Bangor, subject to the further orders of the Commander-in-Chief.

The Quartermaster and Paymaster from the Fourth Division, will report themselves to the Adjutant General at Headquarters, on Wednesday the sixth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon.

All the troops aforesaid will appear at their several places of rendezvous, with the arms and equipments of their respective corps, including knapsacks and blankets, required by law for actual service. Each man will furnish himself with three days' provisions; and officers commanding Regiments and Battalions will forthwith notify the selectmen of towns, to cause the detachment from their respective towns to be attended on their march with suitable carriages, provisions, camp equipage and camp utensils, until notice shall be given them by the commanding officer to desist.

Major Generals will forward complete rolls of both officers and men, designating the Companies, Regiments and Brigades from which they were taken, to the office of the Adjutant General, with all possible dispatch.

The several field and staff officers of the draft, from the Sixth Division, will report themselves with the other troops from their Division to

the Adjutant General at Headquarters; and those from the Eighth Division, will report themselves with the troops from that Division to Major General Bodfish, who will organize his draft into a Regiment.

The detachment hereby called into service, will serve for the term of three months, unless sooner discharged by the Commander-in-Chief.

Colonel Orison Ripley of the First Regiment, First Brigade and Sixth Division, is ordered into service, and he will report himself to the Adjutant General at Headquarters, on Monday the fourth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and await orders.

Colonel Nathan Goodridge of the First Regiment, Second Brigade, and Eighth Division, is ordered into service, and he will report himself to his Major General, at Skowhegan, on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at hime o'clock in the forenoon and await orders.

General Order, No. 12 of this date is so far altered, as to permit Major General Jewett of the Fifth Division, to receive the "A" Company of Light Infantry, and the "A" Company of Riflemen, both in the Third Regiment of the Second Brigade in said Division, with the several officers, sergeants, one drummer and one fifer, and all the privates not exceeding sixty-four in number, in each company, as a part of the draft ordered from his Division, by General Order, No. 12; and to complete the number required by said General Order, he will make regular detail and draft from the detachment made pursuant to General Order, No. 7, of February 19, 1839.

General Order, No. 15.

Major General Alvan Bolster of the Sixth Division, will immediately order into the service of the State from his Division, in addition to the detachment directed by General Order, No. 12, of February 27, 1839, four Captains, four Lieutenants, four Ensigns, sixteen Sergeants, four Drummers, four Fifers, and two hundred and fifty-six privates of Infantry; one Captain, two Lieutenants, four Sergeants, one Drummer, one Fifer and

sixty-four privates of Artillery; and one Captain, one Lieutenant, one Ensign. four Sergeants, one Drummer, one Fifer and sixty-four privates of Light Infantry.

This additional draft will be armed, provided for in every respect, and rendezvous, as mentioned in General Order, No. 12, for the detachment in the Sixth Division, and remain in service three months; unless sooner discharged by the Commander-in-Chief. General Bolster will cause the Company of Artillery to be properly armed for field duty.

General Order, No. 16.

On the mustering of any detachment of troops ordered into the service of the State, at the place of rendezvous, should there be any material deficiency of able-bodied officers or men, the officer ordered to command such detachment will forthwith notify the Major Generals of the Divisions from which the detachment was ordered stating the number of deficiencies, and the companies, regiments and brigades from which they were severally detached; and on receipt of such notice the Major Generals will proceed by detail and draft and make up the deficiency from the proper companies, regiments and brigades, with the least possible delay, and cause them to rendezvous at such time and place as the officer commanding the detachment shall specify in his notice to the Major Generals. The commanding officer of the detachment will also cause suitable officers of his command to appear at the place of rendezvous appointed by him. And when the remaining part of his troops shall have assembled, they will proceed under the command of the senior officer thereof, to join the detachment. In all cases of making a draft, each Major General will cause returns thereof, both officers and men to be made to him, stating the companies, regiments and brigades from which they were severally taken. And in case any draft is made of troops and called into active service, Major Generals will in all cases cause the company officers, non-commissioned officers and privates to be immediately organized into companies, and forthwith returned as such to the office of the Adjutant General, and also to the commanding officer of the detachment at the time and place of rendezvous.

This additional draft will be armed, provided for in every respect, and rendezvous, as mentioned in General Order, No. 12, for the detachment in the Eighth Division, and remain in service three months, unless sooner discharged by the Commander-in-Chief.

The Commander-in-Chief directs the following as the component parts of the ration to be issued to the Militia of this State, when in actual service, viz.:—three-quarters of a pound of pork or bacon, or one and a quarter pounds of fresh or salt beef, eighteen ounces of bread or flour, or twelve ounces of hard bread, or one and a quarter pounds of corn meat, and at the rate of four pounds of soap, one and a half pounds of candles, two quarts of salt, four quarts of vinegar, eight quarts of peas or beans, and when practicable, two pounds of tea, and twelve pounds of sugar or the equivalent in molasses, to every one hundred rations.

No allowance will be made to troops who do not receive all the parts mentioned for the rations, but commissaries are directed to cause such parts thereof as can be furnished without great inconvenience and increased expense, to be delivered to the troops at every post when so required.

Officers commanding detachments in service will cause this order to be immediately promulgated that there may be no misapprehensions by any one in relation to the rations.

In directing the discharge of the troops under command of Colone Ripley, the Commander-in-Chief avails himself of the occasion, to expres to the detachment his warm thanks for the prompt manner in which the have responded to the call made for their services, as well as for their good conduct while quartered at the Capital. The rapid progress made in discipline, during the short time they have been on duty, is highly creditable to both officers and men, and it is another evidence that our patriotic citizen soldiery, while they are at all times ready to march in defence of our country's rights, also possess those qualities indispensable to the establishment of an efficient army "good order and subordination."

But in deciding that the condition of our border difficulties has so changed since the order directing the draft of militia from the Fifth and Sixth Divisions, as to render the services of this detachment not as present necessary, the Commander-in-Chief would remind them, that while he flatters himself with the hope that such justice will be done the State in regard to our boundary, as will render it unnecessary again to call in the aid of military power to preserve the integrity of our soil, yet that it is the duty of every community to be prepared to protect by physical force, those rights ever dear to a free people; and although the members of the detachment will forthwith return to their respective homes and firesides, they will recollect that their services may again be necessary; and should that emergency unfortunately occur, the Commander-in-Chief doubts not that they will respond to any further call, with that alacrity which has ever characterized the Militia of Maine.

The detachment from the second Division, will without delay return to Bangor under Brigadier General Bachelder, who will report his command as the several Companies thereof shall arrive, to the Adjutant

General at that city.

The officer left in command at Fort Fairfield and at the Presque Isle, on being notified by the Land Agent that a sufficient civil force has been procured to enable him to protect the public property, will immediately retire to Bangor with his command, and report to the Adjutant General.

Brigadier General Bachelder will leave a guard at township number ten on the Aroostook road, sufficient to protect such public stores as may from necessity be left at that post. This guard will be subject to the

orders of the acting Quartermaster General.

Deeming it unnecessary longer to continue a military force on the northeastern frontier, the Commander-in-Chief directs that the Militia be discharged without delay; and he takes this occasion to express to the detachments from the second and third Divisions, his entire satisfaction with the manner in which they obeyed the call into the service of the State for the protection of the rights and honor of Maine; and their general conduct while in the public service, as reported by their respective commanding officers, merits, as it receives, his warm approbation.

Called into active service at a season unusual for military operations, without preparation and without experience, much inconvenience if not suffering must have been felt by the detachments on duty. It has been the intention of the Commander-in-Chief to render their condition one of as much comfort as the nature of the service would permit; and the zeal and alacrity with which they have obeyed the call for their aid, is sure evidence that Maine can rely with perfect confidence on the patriotism of her citizen soldiery, for the protection of her honor, and the vindication of her rights.
