District 39 Will Mark 75th Year

District 39 of Pierce county, located 5 miles north and 2 east of Wee Town, will celebrate its 75th or Diamond Anniversary on Sunday afternoon, October 6.

All former teachers, residents, school officers, county superintendents and students of the district are asked to join the people of the district at the school house on that day to help celebrate this event. Others interested are also welcome.

Scrapbook Information

One of the projects the school children have for this year is to make a scrapbook of information they can gather about the history of the district. Former teachers, residents, county superintendents, officers and students are asked to help with this project. They wish to include letters containing memories of the events in the school.

TO MARK JUBILEE

District 39 in Pierce county, located five miles north and two east of Wee Town, will mark its diamond anniversary on Sunday, October 6. All former teachers, residents, school officers and students are asked to help observe the event. One of the projects the school children have had was to make a scrapbook of the district's history. Any who wish to include letters containing memories of the events in the school are invited to submit them. Mrs. Forest Schreiner of Pierce is the teacher.

Pictures will also be greatly appreciated whether taken in the past or taken at the present time or both. These will all be included in the scrapbook and will later be donated to the Pierce County Historical Society.

No formal invitations are being sent except to those who reside a great distance away from the school and for whom addresses are known.

Land Donated

Ferd Scheer, father of County Treasurer Herman Scheer, donated the land for the school and was the first director. On January 20, 1888, County Superintendent Charles Gates sent a notice of the first meeting to be held on March 13, 1888. The formation of District 39 was completed April 10, 1888.

Present officers are Wilfred Meyer, Delbert Nathan and Glen Dowling, all of Randolph. There are 17 pupils enrolled this year. The teacher is Mrs. Forest Schreiner of Pierce.
