## Dist. 39, Pierce County, Will Mark 75th Anniversary

PIERCE — School district 39 of Pierce County, located five miles north and two east of Wee Town, will celebrate its 75th anniversary on Sunday afternoon, Oct. 6.

Former teachers, students, residents, school officers, county superintendents and other interested persons have been asked to join the people of the district at the schoolhouse that day to help celebrate the event.

No formal invitations are being sent except to those who reside a great distance and whose addresses are known.

One of the projects of the school children in the district this year is to make a scrapbook

of information they gather about the history of the district. Anyone who can contribute to this is asked to submit material to the school. The students are especially interested in letters containing memories of events at the school and pictures from the present or past. The scrapbook will be donated to the Pierce County Historical Society.

Ferd Scheer, father of Pierce County Treasurer Herman Scheer, donated the land for the school and was the first director. On Jan. 20, 1888, County Superintendent Charles Gates sent a notice of the first meeting to be held March 13, 1888. The formation of district 39 was completed April 10, 1888.

Present officers are Wilfred Meyer, Delbert Nathan and Glen Dowling, all of Randolph. There are 17 pupils enrolled this year and the teacher is Mrs. Forest Schreiner of Pierce.
