## **McCready**

**Napoleon McCready**, b. Jan. 05, 1851 in St. Romauld, Province of Quebec, d. Nov. 23, 1918, Berlin, NH, m. Nov. 17, 1874 in St. Romauld, PQ to **Celina Roberge**, b. Jan. 25, 1858, S. Romauld, P.Q., d. Feb. 26, 1942, Berlin, NH. They had 12 children, 10 sons and 2 daughters. Napoleon and Celina had been living in Norton, Vermont and moved to Berlin in Sept. 1897 to be near Celina's sister.

**Alphonse Napoleon McCready** was their 3rd child. He was born in St. Romauld, Quebec (Canada) on 23 February 1879. He came with his family to the US when he was 18 (abt.1897). He married in Berlin, NH on 24 June1912 to **Anna Alma Boivin.** She died 8 October 1924 in Berlin. Alphonse was naturalized as a United States citizen on 5 November 1904.

Alphonse and Alma owned a grocery store on Champlain Street. They had 6 children: Simone McCready (b. 1913), Peter McCready (b. 1914, d. 2002), Raymond McCready (b. 1916, d. 1970), Rene McCready (b. 1918, d. 1996) Gabriel McCready (b. 1921, d.1972). An additional child was born in 1920, died in 1921 and is buried in the St. Anne's cemetery family plot.

Alphonse remarried after the death of his first wife. They had a child that died in infancy in 1926 (also buried at the St. Anne's cemetery family plot). He was the Coös County Commissioner from 1928-1940. Alphonse died in New Jersey in 1953 and is buried in the family plot.
