Misouria Tippins departed this life the 9 day of May 1886.

Georgeann A. Johnson departed this life Sept. the 28, 1895.

Susan Johnson departed this life April 29, 1898.

Neal Talmadge Tippins departed this life Feb. 18, 1922.

Robert Eugene Tippins departed this life July 5, 1918.

Emma Tippins departed this life July 8, 1929.

Susan Jane Tippins departed this life January 5, 1931 at the
age of 80 years 11 months.

Edgar Tippins departed this life October 14, 1936 at the age
of 58 years and 9 months.

George W. Tippins departed this life September 21, 1937, age
86 years, 9 months and 18 days.

(NOTE: If you compare some of the marriage dates of the
children of Elias Johnson, such as William J. Johnson
and Mary Ann Douglas, with the dates presented in the
sketch on Elias E. Johnson in Issue #1, you will note
a discrepancy. The dates in the sketch are from the
marriage books from the courthouses in the various
counties where they married. Perhaps the dates in the
Bible were entered months later, therefore the dif-
ference.)

THE 1860 FEDERAL CENSUS OF FLORIDA

Each entry has two numbers: the first one designates the dwelling
houses numbered in order of visitation and the second one is for
the families numbered in order of visitation. For each free person
in a household an entry shows the name, age, sex, color, occupation
if over 15 years of age, name of the State, Territory, or country
of birth, and whether or not he was married within the year. In
the following census data (as in the Manatee Census in Issue #1),
the sex of the individual is not given unless it is an unusual
name, and only occupations other than farming are shown. Other
data on the 1860 Census such as value of real estate or value of
personal estate is not given in this transcription. For more

1860 Hillsborough County Census

Hillsborough County, Florida was created in 1834 from the
counties of Alachua and Monroe. In 1860 it contained the present
day counties of Pinellas, Hillsborough and part of Polk. Tampa
is the county seat.
