After eleven years of research, Mr. Clyde S. Stephens has completed a publication on his family entitled STEPHENS ANCESTORS AND PIONEER RELATIVES - THE STEWART, RICH, DAVENPORT, FRANKLIN, HOWARD, WEEKS, DUNCAN, MCLEOD, DEVANE, BULLOCK, TIPPETT AND OTHER FAMILIES OF THE 1800'S. Families are followed from South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama to Florida and Texas. Pioneer history is recorded in Southwest Fla. from Tampa to Naples and inland to the Peace River, plus some accounts from Texas are presented. There are 146 pages with 46 photographs, 19 family charts covering three generations each and maps and charts on pioneer communities and counties. Mr. Stephens is currently living in Panama, Panama but copies of his book can be ordered for \$15 from Carl W.
