

EZEKIEL JOSIAH HULL 1827-1897

Ezekiel Josiah Hull was born in Burke County, Georgia on July 4, 1827. His father may be the Ezekiel Hull listed in the 1830 Burke County census.

Ezekiel married Mary Miller about 1851. She was born Apr. 1, 1834 in Georgia, probably daughter of John James & Nancy Miller. Children of Ezekiel Josiah and Mary Hull:

1. Sarah E. Hull, born 1852; died before 1878; married Moses T. Howell in Polk County, Fl. on October 14, 1872. Moses was the son of Joseph Howell and Sarah (Turner) Sistrunk Howell.
2. Daniel Webster Hull, born January 14, 1854; died December 9, 1932; married on June 13, 1878 in Manatee County, Alice Lee Hendry daughter of James Madison and Mary Jane (Payne) Hendry.
3. Didema Selema Hull, born 1856; married Henry H. Norris in 1873.
4. James Miller Hull, born 1858; died young.
5. Cynthia Hull, born November 12, 1861; died January 30, 1934; married Moses T. Howell on December 24, 1878 after the death of her sister, Sarah E. (Hull) Howell.
6. Artemus Floyd Hull, born 1863; died 1939; married Sallie Frances Bulloch on September 18, 1887 in DeSoto County, Fl.
7. Mary E. "Mollie" Hull, born January 5, 1870, twin; died at age 18 with pneumonia.
8. William A. Hull, born January 5, 1870; died March 27, 1914; married Donelis "Donella" Smith.
9. A. Belle Hull, born June 12, 1874; died May 14, 1945; married David Wesley Mizell son of George Clinton and Mary (Platt) Mizell.

Ezekiel and his family were living in Volusia County, Florida in the 1860 census in the Enterprise community. He was listed as a timber cutter. Living in the same county were William Hull, age 43 & family and John James & Nancy Miller.

In the 1860's the Hull family settled in the eastern Hillsborough County area. E. J. Hull was delegate from Beulah Church in Polk County on October 20, 1869 to the third annual South Florida Baptist Association meeting held at Shiloh Church. He was elected clerk.

The Hull family was enumerated in the 1870 Hillsborough County census. On November 12, 1870 E. J. Hull represented Beulah Church again as a delegate along with J. R. Stewart to the fourth annual session of the South Florida Baptist Association meeting held at
