

Pine Pleasant Church in Hillsborough County. He was listed as a minister (licentiate) of the association and gave his post office as Alafia.

In 1875 Ezekiel Hull was listed as pastor at Friendship Church in Manatee County. In 1876 he gave his post office as Pine Level. M. T. Howell was a delegate from Friendship Church that year. Ezekiel attended the first annual session of the Manatee Missionary Baptist Association on October 27, 1876. He was appointed to the Articles of Faith committee. In 1877 he was shown as pastor at Alafia, Mt. Pleasant, Mt. Moriah & Friendship churches. He was pastor at New Zion, Mt. Moriah, Mt. Pleasant & Alafia in 1879. On November 12, 1880 he was elected moderator of the fifth annual session of the Manatee Missionary Baptist Association. In 1893 he was shown as the pastor of Mt. Ephraim, New Hope and Wauchula churches.

In the mid-1870's the Hull family settled in the Pine Level area of Manatee County. They were listed there in the 1880 census along with James H. Johnson, Charles Whidden, Webster Hull, Wells Hanchy and Joshua Platt.

The 1885 Manatee County agricultural schedule shows that Ezekiel J. Hull owned 260 acres of wooded and pasture land, 2 horses and 14 cattle.

Ezekiel Josiah Hull died April 20, 1897 and was buried in the Wauchula Cemetery.

Mary Hull, age 66, was living at Pine Level with Moses and Scynthia Howell in the 1900 DeSoto County census.

Mary died April 21, 1901 according to her tombstone. The Bullock Bible states that Mrs. E. J. Hull died March 15, 1901.
