

FOREWORD



HE eventful day, when the news was given out that Otoe County and the United States had thrown itself into war, was on April 6th, 1917. That she had thrown herself into the most stupendous conflict of ages was flashed to Otoe County and the World. She was to raise and equip an army of millions and send them 3000 miles across the sea, that they might fight beside heroic France.

England, Belgium and Italy for the cause of Liberty. For nearly four years every recognized power had been struggling in the most colossal death grip in history. Democracy and Freedom was at stake and just as the fate of civilized world seemed to hang by a thread the United States of America was to hurl her gigantic forces against democracy's common for


As Germany and the rest of her junkers were calling America's declaration a "bluff", America was steadily equipping an army to send across to crush the foe. Patriotism leaped with bound upon bound in the true American breasts of millions, and their one aim was to crush Germany and every autocrat. The spirit of '76 was kindled as over night. There was but one common purpose and factions, races and creeds forgot their differences and united into one. Every effort of every true American was to be pooled in the cause of Right. America was at war, men, money and energy was laid at her door.

More than 800 were from Otoe County, Nebraska of this splendid army. Fighting and training to fight in every arm of the United States Forces, doughboys, artillerymen, marines, sailors, aviators, nurses, they fought nobly and brought glory to their county and country. They represented almost every military center in France and they upheld the name of the Civil and Spanish war Veterans before them. Now they return to their homes and to their folks, most of them with that honor that comes only to heroes. While they were gone to fight the battles of their country and to protect their homes, those who were compelled to remain at home were not wanting in their splendid suport to them. Millions of dollars in Liberty Bonds were quickly purchased at the request of the Government to clothe and feed them and to equip the armies. Thousands of dollars were quickly subscribed to give comfort and care for the boys in camps. Red Cross solicitors found eager men, women and children in Otoe County willing to give to support the wonderful organization whose only aim it was to give aid to the boys and suffering ones on the battle fields of France. Kniting and sewing for the Red Cross was done by mothers and sisters who worked day and night with the enthusiasm which only a mother's and sister's love can give. Every movement that was inaugurated in Otoe County, and there were many, that called uppn the people for their time and money, was cheerfully and willingly responded to and a more loyal County did not exist in the United States. Patriotism and Loyalty were the two lone words in every citizens vocabulary.

That the work of Otoe County in the World War may be set down in generations to come; that the work of Otoe County's eight hundred and some fighting men may be memorialized; that Otoe County's good women may pass on to their daughters of future generations the story of their unselfish devotion in the cause of Liberty; that our sons and daughters and their children may be proud of the wonderful record of loyalty of their ancestors in stamping out that Prussianism that early in the twentieth century threatened the Liberty loving world, that the history of Otoe County in the war may be written into a permanent form, that is the purpose for which this book is prepared. If there are omissions or errors, it is asked that they be overlooked with the knowledge that the task was a big one and a difficult one. In many instances the data that has been handed to us from the different sources has been none too correct when given. If there has been any picture or data left out of any patriotic worker, we offer our sincerest apology. We have searched every corner for history, have eneavored to cooperate with the chairman of each district of war activities and have made a very great effort to make it complete. If our critics will fully realize the task we have been to, and they themselves put forth their efforts for such a permanent war history of Otoe County in the late World War, then their criticisms might be kept down to a small margin.

There was hardly a home in Otoe County that was not personally or vitally interested in the war. There were sorrows and hardships in all these families. Twenty-eight men made the supreme sacrifice on the altar of democracy, some on the battle field, some in the hospital, and it seems just, yes very just, that the memory of those men who died in the United States Uniform, be remembered and honored by every true citizen of Otoe County. They are the men who died for home and honor, they paid the supreme sacrifice for their home, loved ones and country, their memory should be cherished for everlasting and their unselfish service should stand as a monument to their memory throughout the home of every patriot of Otoe County.

Private, son of Wm. and Stella Neeley, Nebraska City, was born at Sidney, Ia. Entered the service at Nebraska City, June 6, 1918. Served at Newport, R. I. Died at Newport, R. I., September 23, 1918, from Influenza.

WILLIAM H. MASSIE

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Massie, Unadilla, Nebraska, was born at Percival, Ia.. January 18, 1896. Entered the service at Belle Fouche, S. D., August 1, 1918. Served in United States, France and Germany, Battery A. 19th Field Artillery, 5th Division. Killed by train, having both legs cut off, March 17, 1919.



FORD D. SPENCER

Private, son of Frank and Ella Spencer, was born in Kansas City, December 9, 1891. Entered the service in Omaha, Nebr., December 9, 1917. Served at Kelly Field, San Antonio, Tex. Died of pneumonia fever January 17, 1918. Ford was one of Otoe County's youngest boys who died in the service.

WM. CLYDE RANKIN

Private, was born at Utica, O., July 11, 1876. Entered the service at Rouleau, Canada, in 1916. Served in France, 229 Battalion, Company C. A. E. F. Also served in England, Scotland and France in Canadian Exposition Forces. He and five others were killed by shell explosion while in action in France October 23, 1917.





VERNON M. ROBB

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. F. N. Robb, Douglas, Nebr. was born at Silver Creek, February 13, 1901. Entered the service at Lincoln, April 30, 1917. Served at Camp Cody, Merritt and Overseas, Company A, Artillery 134th, 34th Division. Transferred overseas to 125th M. G. Company, 32 Mch Division. Killed August 31, 1918. Following extract from letter from his First Lieutenant: "Vernon was killed or rather fatally wounded on August 31, near Guvigny, France north of Soissons by a Boche barrage. It was on the return trip that party of eight who volunteered to go back for food and bring it to our men through a heavy Boch barrage. It was on the return trip that he was hit, the same shell killing two of his comrades also.

JOHN E. WALLS

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Walls, Nebraska City, was born in Nebraska City, October 24, 1896. Entered the service at Nebraska City, June 26, 1918. Served in France, 112 Field Hospital. Transferred to 102 Ambulance Company. Died of wounds received while engaged in action on the Argone Fores Sector, October 3, 1918.



CLARENCE FRED FLAMME

Private, son of Elizabeth and William Flamme, Otoe, was born at Otoe, October 23, 1895. Entered the service at Nebraska City, June 26, 1918. Served at Camp Funston, Camp Raritan, Aberdeen Proving Ground. Transferred to Camp Perry Erie Proving Grounds. Died of pneumonia October 12, 1918.

THOMAS ANDREW RICHARDS

Corporal, son of Elder and Mrs. Jno. Richards, Syracuse, was born April 4, 1894. Entered the service July 15, 1917, Company B, Battery 5th Nebraska National Guard. Was killed June 6th at York, Pennsylvania while returning home from a reception given by the churches of that city, he fell from an army truck. He was one of the men selected to go as a tanker to Camp Colt, Pennsylvania, March 16, 1918. Funeral was held at the home of his parents June 10, 1918.





WILLIAM ADAM SCHELLINGER

Messenger, son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Schellinger, Nebraska City, was born at Nebraska City, June 23, 1892. Entered the service at Nebraska City, April 29, 1918. Served at Camp Funston, Camp Mills and overseas, Company I. 355th Infantry, 89th Division. Killed in battle in the St. Mihiel sailent September 14, 1918. Extracts of a letter from his Chaplin follows: "It was on the morning of September 14, about 9:30, we had driven the enemy back and had them on the run yet they laid down a heavy barrage. One shell burst in the midst of the squad of which William was a member killing four men and wounding four. William was instantly killed, hence had no pain or suffer-I buried him with other comrades that had fallen by his side. He died at the front and facing the enemy.

OTTO GOTTWALD

Private, son of Albin and Anna Gottwald, Nebraska City, was born October 25, 1895. Entered the service at Camp Dodge, Ia., July 22, 1918. Served at Camp Dodge and Des Moines, Ia. Medical Department B. H. Died of pneumonia, following an attack of Influenza, October 10, 1918. Was brought home for burial and laid to rest at St. Joseph Cemetery, Paul, Nebr.



RILEY BRYAN

Corporal, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. S. Bryan, Talmage, was born at Brock. Entered the service at Tecumseh, June 26, 1917. Served at Camp Cody, New Mexico, Company M. 6th Nebraska. Transferred to Company D, 109 Supply Train and later transferred to General Hospital at Fort Bayard, New Mex. where he died from Acute Neifritas on January 10, 1918.



ALFRED J. JENSEN

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. Nels P. Jensen, Palmyra, was born at Palmyra June 2, 1894. Entered the service at Nebraska City, July 22, 1918. Served at Camp Dodge, Ia., Company 37, 163 D. B. 10th Battalion. Transferred to Camp Lee, Va. 2nd Company V. T. S. where his death occurred on October 11, 1918 from pneumonia following the influenza.





ROSS HENRY JAY

Sailor, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph P. Jay, Nebraska City, was born September 4, 1894. Entered the service at Goat Island, Cal. and served in Mare Island Hospital in charge of a ward of men who had influenza. He contracted the dreaded disease from which he died.

CARL J. HOLTGREWEE

Private, son of Mrs. Caroline Holtgrewee, Lorton, Nebr., was born at Lorton September 27, 1890. Entered the service at Nebraska City, September 20, 1917. Served at Camp Funston, New port News and France, 355 Company 89th Division Co. F. Carl was killed by a German shrapnel at Chauteau Thierry as he was advancing across Marne. He was killed instantly, the shrapnel cutting a gap in the back of his head. Carl was the first Otoe County boy to be killed in battle and was buried in France by his corporal and comrades.



HAROLD E. HARKCOM

Private, son of Thomas J. and Lucile Harkcom, Nebraska City, was born at Palmyra. April 17, 1898. Served on the Mexican Border with Company B Battery 134th U. S. Infantry Transferred to Headquarters Company 134th U. S. Infantry January 26, 1917. Died of pneumonia February 4, 1917. Harold was the first boy from Nebraska City to give his life for his country.



HOWARD M. NASH

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Nash, Palmyra, Nebr., was born at Palmyra, October 27, 1893. He entered the service at Nebraska City, September 19, 1918. Served at Manhattan, Kansas where he commenced a course of wireless telegraphy. When the influenza attacked the camp he was detailed to help care for his sick comrades until the 8th of October when he was stricken with the disease and passed away on the 16th of October, 1918.

HARRY E. SCHREIBER

Sergeant, son of Mrs. Charles Bockrocker, Nebraska City, was born at Beatrice, Nebr., October 7, 1894. Entered the service at Nebraska City April 29, 1918. Served overseas Ev. Hospital 10. Died of pneumonia November 28, 1918. Extract from letter by his comrades to his wife, "We who have worked with Harry, some of us from the time the company was first organized, have learned to love him as a brother. Kind and generous to a fault, he was one of the most popular men in the organization and his cheerful presence will be missed by every officer and enlisted man in our hospital. His loss falls equally upon us and we unite in extending to you and his child our heartfelt sympathy."

CHARLES C. BICKEL

2nd Seaman Navy, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Bickel, was born in Omaha, Nebr., March 27, 1892. Entered the service at Omaha, Served at the Great Lakes, Ill. Company 2 Reg. 13. Died of preumonia following Influence September 25, 1918.



JOHN RAMOLD

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ardrew Ramold, was born in Nebraska City, February 8, 1895. Entered the service at Nebraska City Served at South Carolina and overseas. Killed June 8, 1918 in battle at Chateau Thierry.

MONAS JOHNSON HAWLEY

First Lieutenant, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. E. Hawley, Nebraska City, was born at Edgar May 22, 1891. Entered the service at Presido, San Francisco, Cal., August 25, 1917. Served A. E. F. and in France, 11th Field Artillery, Died on the 19th day of March 1919 in Base Hospital No. 48 France. Lieutenant Hawley died after five days illness, the cause being Cerebral Spinal Meningitis.





JEAN M. G. MILLET

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. August Millet Julian, Nebr., was born at Aymaville, Italy, July 16, 1881. Entered the service at Nebraska City, March 1918. Served at Camp Greene, N. C. and in France, Killed at the Marne October 3, 1918.

CHARLES E. WICKLINE

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. A. Wickline, was born in Phillips Co., Kans., June 11, 1887. He came to Nebraska City in 1889 from which city he entered the service. Served at Camp Funston, Kans. Died at Fort Riley. Kans. November 1, 1918.



REV. WESLEY WELLINGTON BARNES

Rector of St. Marys Episcopal Church, Nebraska City, Nebr., and overseas Secretary Y. M. C.A., was born at Plattsmouth, November 12, 1882. Entered the service at Nebraska City, November 16, 1918. Died at New York City, N. Y., December 2nd, 1918. Mr. Barnes was accepted for service the last of July but was not called until in November.

ALBERT H. REUTER

Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. David Reuter. Otoe, Nebr., was born near Otoe, April 22, 1896. Entered the service at Camp Funston. Kans., September 19, 1917. Served at Camp Funston, Company F 355 Infantry. Transferred to Company B 38 Battery Presido, Cal. and then to U. S. Guards. Died November 5, 1918 with influenza while stationed at Presido, Cal.





DEAN C. WALKER

Sergeant, son of Mr. and Mrs. James C. Walker, Dunbar, Nebr., was born at Dunbar, March 8, 1895. Entered the service at Camp Lee, Va., June 10, 1918. Served at Camp Lee and in France. Died of Influenza, October 21, 1918. In five weeks from the time he enlisted he had arrived in France and was in active service. Always thought it an honor as he was in the first complete Veterinary Hospital Unit to be sent across.


HENRY A. STILWELL

LAWRENCE GOOKIN

Private, son of Samuel and Lydia Gookin Dunbar, Nebr., was born May 4, 1883, at Chariton, Ia. Entered the service September, 1916, at San Francisco, Cal. Served in the U. S. A. and France. Was with wagon Company 1 Division train A. E. F. Later died of disease February 22, 1918.



Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Burr, Dunbar, Nebr., was born in Otoe County, Nebr., October 27, 1896. Entered the service at Nebraska City, July 22, 1918. Served at Camp Dodge, Ia., Company 37th 10 Battalion, 163 D. B. Died of Spanish Influenza October 13, 1918.





COLONEL WILLIAM HAYWARD.

Colonel William Hayward, 15th N. Y., 369th U. S., son of M. L. and J. P. Hayward, was born in Nebraska City, Nebraska, April 29, 1877. Entered the service at Camp Whitman, N. Y., July 15, 1917. Served in United States and France. Was wounded, ear drum broken, and also gassed while in service. Given the Croix De Guerre, Distinguished Service Medal; Officers' Legion of Honor Medal. Discharged March 1, 1919.

ALEXANDER, FRANK, Cook, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. Alexander of Syracuse, was born November 17. 1887, near Syracuse. Entered the service at Nebraska City, Neb., October 3, 1917. He received his early training at Camp Funston and later went overseas with the 341st Field Artillery of the famous 89th division. He saw active service at the front and was with the army of occupation in Germany. In business at Syracuse, Neb.

ANDERSON, HAROLD A., Private 1cl., son of Andy and Helen Anderson of Syracuse, was born July 26, 1898 at Syracuse. Entered the service February 25, 1918, at Ft. Logan, Colo. Served at Coyaux, France, for nine months with the 36th aero squadron, and motor cycle corps as a mechanic. Landed in the United States March 24, 1919. Discharged. Now living at Dunbar, Neb.

ALBERS, HERMAN H., Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fritz Albers, Nebraska City, was born at Nebraska City, December 22, 1889, Entered the service at Seattle. Wash., in March 1918. Served at Ft. Leavenworth and in France with Company B. 31st Engineers. His address at this time is Company L., Trans. Corps, 14th Division. Still in service.



Logan and Ft. Worden, Wash., in the Quartermaster Corps. Was chief pay and finance clerk, Coast Defenses of Puget Sound. Discharged at Camp Dodge, March 25, 1919. Now living at Syracuse.

AMENDE, CARL W., First Lieutenant, Infantry, U. S. A., son of Mr. and Mrs. E. W. Amende, Syracuse, was born March 2, 1896, at Syracuse. Entered the service May 12, 1917, at Ft. Snelling, Minnesota, Officers Training Camp, commissioned Second Lieutenant August 15, 1917, at Ft. Snelling. Served with the 88th Division at Camp Dodge, Ia.; 33rd Division, Camp Logan, Tex.; 76th Division, Camp Devens, Mass.; Instructor, Training Detachment, Brown University, Providence, R. I., May 14, 1918 to December 21, 1918. Promoted to First Lieutenant at Brown University. Discharged December 21, 1918. Now living at Syracuse.

ASHTON, EDGAR E.—Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. S. Ashton, Durbar, was born August 30, 1896 at Dunbar, Entered the service at Nebraska City, Neb., August 15, 1918. Served at Camp Jackson, S. C., with Battery E, 13th Regiment, Field Artillery. Discharged January 11, 1919, at Camp Dodge, Ia. Now living at Dunbar.

ABKER. HARRY DICK WILLIAM, Private 1cl., son of William Henry and Anna Abker, Otoe, was born December 24, 1892, at Otoe. Entered the service at Nebraska City, Neb., July 22, 1918. Served with Company A. 88th Infantry at Camp Dodge, Ia., and was later transferred to the Medical Detachment at Camp Dodge,. Discharged February 15, 1918. Expects to follow farming.





ALDRICH, CARL M., Corporal, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Aldrich, Nebraska City, was born at Shelbyville, Ill., April 30, 1884. Entered the service at Omaha, Neb., December 29, 1917. Served at Camp Holabird, Md. Discharged January 27, 1919.

ALDRICH, GLEN T., Lieutenant, (P. C.) Navy, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Aldrich, Nebraska City, was born at Galva, Ill., December 2, 1886. Entered the service at Pittsburg, Pa., April 7, 1917. Served in European Waters. Transferred to Fleet Supply Base, New York. Discharged July 6, 1919.

ALDRICH, RALF J., Second Lieutenant, F. A., son of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Aldrich, Nebraska City, was born at Peoria, Ill., February 1, 1891. Entered the service October 5, 1917. Served in U. S. A. A. S. and F. A. Discharged May 3, 1918.

ANDREWS, FRED R., Sergeant, son of Mrs. M. Andrews, Nebraska City, was born in Nebraska City. February 23, 1893. Entered the service at Nebraska City. June 27, 1918. Served at Fort Riley and A. E. F. Medical Det. 48 Ambulance. Still in service.

ANDERSON, ALFRED C., Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Anderson, Nehawka, was born June 8, 1894. Entered the service in Omaha, Neb., May 11, 1918. Served in Cuba, Hayti, 153 Co. 2nd Reg. Still in service.

ACHENBACH, DR. WM. H., First Lieutenant, son of Edward and Annette Achenbach, was born at Girardville, Pa., June 23, 1870. Entered the service at Nebraska City. Served at Base Hospital No. 1, Sam Houston, Base Hospital No. 3, Brownsville, Tex., Dental Corps Medical Department. Seven weeks on the Mexican Border. Recommended four times for promotion also recommended for the regular army. Discharged from Camp Dodge, Ia., August 7, 1919.

ANDREWS, CHARLES CLIFTON, Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Andrews, Syracuse, was born at Syracuse, September 15, 1893. Entered the service at Nebraska City, Neb., September 19,1917. Served at Camp Funston, Kan., Co. F. 355 Infantry. Transferred to Camp Pike, Ark. Discharged January 4, 1919.

BRADEHOFT, PAUL T., Private, son of Lutch and Adeline Bradehoft, Nebraska City, was born in Nebraska City, January 12, 1891. Entered the service at Nebraska City. Served at Camp Dodge, Ia. Headquarters Co. 88 Infantry. Discharged January 28, 1919. BARRETT, LEO RALPH, Private 1cl., son of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Barrett, Syracuse, was born at Thurman, Ia. Entered the service at Nebraska City, Neb., July 15, 1918. Served at Camp Dodge, Ia., with 37th Company, 19th Division. Division ready to go to France just before the armistice was signed but was quarantined on account of influenza. Last served in the Base Hospital Medical Department at Camp Dodge, Ia. Discharged.

BECKARD, JOHN, Private, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Beckard of Unadilla, was born in Germany. September 15, 1896. Entered the service at Camp Funston. Served with Company B, 355th Infantry with the fighting 89th Division. Was in most of the important battles with that division. Discharged at Camp Funston. Now farming near Unadilla.

BESCH, ALLEN A., Private 1cl., son of Mrs. Caroline Besch, Unadilla, was born October 26, 1893, at Unadilla. Entered the service September 20, 1917, at Camp Funston, Kan. Served with Company F, 355th infantry, 89th Division. Was in all the battles of the division and with the army of occupation in Germany. Discharged June, 2, 1919. Now farming near Unadilla.



Was with Field Remount Squadron No. 366 and later transferred to Base Surgeon's Office, Base Section No. 1, A. E. F. Discharged and Low living at Syracuse.

BOCK, EDWARD J., Mechanic, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Bock, Bland, Missouri, was born June 13, 1889, Bland, Missouri. Entered the service at Camp Dodge, Ia., May 28, 1918. Served at Camp Upton, Camp Dodge and overseas with Company H. 350th Infantry, 88th Division. Division cited by French as possessing best Intelligence Organization of any command occupying their sector. In all important battles. Attended military school at St. Toire, France. Discharged. Now living at Syracuse. Neb.

BOCK, CLARENCE H., Private, son of Henry and Anna Bock, Syracuse, was born July 6, 1895, Syracuse. Entered the service July 22, 1918, Camp Dodge, Ia. THE LOCAL BOARD

The Local Board was assigned the task of making classifications of somekind for each registrant, some of which were final. This involved careful, conscientious, paintaking investigation of each individ-ual case. In the first instance these investigations were made by the Secretary of the board, Mr. Oliver Stevenson. So carefully and impartially were these investigations carried out, that with but few exceptions the classifications were made upon his reports. It was a part of the duty of the Secretary and his assistant, Mrs. Oliver Stevenson, to prepare and keep in methodical order the voluminous and intricate records of the office. This in itself was a stupenduous task, but so well was this work done and kept up to the minute so completely that the Provost Marshall General, Captain Walter L. Anderson or Governor Keith Neville could, as they frequently did, telephone to Mr. Stevenson, the Secretary of the Local Board, and asked the number of available men in "Class 1" in Otoe County and receive an immedi-Much credit for this work is due the assistant Secretary Mrs. Oliver Stevenson. All the inductions were made for the County by the Board. In preforming this latter duty, numerous exacting details were worked out from the time the call was made until the men were received in camp.

It is with pardonable pride that it can be recorded that the work of the Board, as explained, rendered for this County to the Government was of a quality of service equal to that of any other Board in the State and excelled by none.

It is to E. H. Fisher, Chairman, Oliver Stevenson, Secretary, Dr. Crudup, Physician, and Mrs. Oliver Stevenson and their creditable office forces, but principally these four to whom credit should be given for the successful operation of the selective service act in Otoe County, most complete and equitable system of mobilizing an army yet known to the world. Many times during the war, measures were advocated and discussed to remunerate the draft board members for their labors. Commissions were to be given them at one time, etc. etc.. but they wanted nothing and were glad and willing to do their work for their country's sake.

Mr. Stevenson, Secretary of the board, and wife, Mrs. Stevenson, were perhaps the busiest of all four. Working night and day on rules and regulations. bending over their heavy burdens of drafting measures at nights, ciphering the Governments equitable system of mobilizing the army and all for the nurpose of fairness to all, they faith'u'ly labored. They

were working for their country; their hearts and souls were implanted in their duties and diligently they plodded through, placing Otoe's County's record on the highest beam in the selective draft service and for this, all of this work, they did not ask any compensation, they gave their efforts, work and accomplishments, which were many, free, willingly and gladly.

At the outbreak of hostilities with the Central Powers it became very evident to those in control of military matters that to increase the military strength and preserve the civil and industrial equilibrium of the nation it would be necessary to institute a Selective Service System. Statistics complied by the Provost Marshal General of the United States at the close of the Civil War show the inadequacies of the volunteer system, and express the hope "that if these lessons are wisely improved the nation would embark in another war, whether foreign or domestic, with incomparably greater advantage for its successful prosecution than were possible at the commencement of the late rebellion." In view of the above facts Congress on the 18th day of May, 1917, passed the Selective Service evactment; the administration of which was placed under the Provost Marshal General of the United States on the principle of "supervised decentralization."

The entire administrative system now consisted of the following parts operating in conjunction: (1) The Provost Marshal General; (2) State Governors and Draft Executive; (3) District Board; (4) Local Board: (5) Government Appeal Agent; (6) Medical Advisory Board; (7) Legal Advisory Board. Appurtenant to this main organization there developed at times a few additional agencies, among which was the Board of Instruction.

On May 22, 1917, by direction of the President, Brigadier General Enoch H. Crowder was detailed as Provost Marshal, and vested with the execution of the selective draft. On April 23, 1917, Governor Keith Neville was designated as the chief executive of the selective service system for the State of Nebraska. Owing to the multifarious duties it became apparent that each state must have an assistant chief executive and Walter L. Anderson was appointed as such in this state.

Two District Boards were appointed for the State of Nebraska, one being known as District Board No. 1, and located at Omaha, for the North Platte territory; and the other as District Board No. 2, located at Lincoln, for the South Platte territory.

The following members composed the Board for the South Platte territory with headquarters at Lincoln, Nebr.

Judge Tibbets succeeded Judge Ashton on Nov. 17, 1918. The former having resigned to go with the National Guard regiment or the 6th Nebraska as they were then called.

The personal of each board consisted of five members, whose duty it was to hear appeals from decisions of the local board, and to make all agricultural and industrial classifications.

Bearing out the chief scheme of decentralized supervision the local boards for the different counties or prencincts were appointed by the Provost Marshal General, and approved by the President, the essential qualification of local board members being from the standpoint of environment rather than from legal or governmental training. The following members were appointed as the Local Board for Otoe County, with headquarters at Nebraska City; E. H. Fischer, Chairman, Oliver Stevenson, Secretary, and Dr. C. P. Crudup, Physician.

Immediately upon its appointment the duties of the local board commenced. Plans were at once devised for carrying out the first registration in accordance with the proclamation issued by the President May 18, 1917. This registration was held in the several voting precincts of the county, as were all succeeding registrations. Sixteen hundred twenty- two men between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-one were registered at this time. Immediately following serial and order numbers were assigned according to regulations.

After the assignment of order numbers a call was received by the local board through the Governor, stating that the quota of Otoe County for the balance of the year 1917, was 52 men. Preparatory to filling this quota physical examinations were conducted, and on the morning of September 6, 1917, Otoe County's first contingent, consisting of three men, left for Camp Funston, Kansas. Under succeeding calls the remaining contingents were inducted, and the first quota of the county was completed.

On December 15, 1917, new regulations became effective, superseding all previous regulations, whereby the physical examination followed instead of preceded the determination of the claim for discharge or exemption. Questionaires were then issued to all registrants for the purpose of aiding the board in determining the status of the registrant relative to classification. These regulations, with amendments, remained effective until the close of the war.

During this time many calls were received by the board for contingents, and also voluntary induction for the special branches. Many young men entered the service by the latter method.

A registration was held on June 5, 1918, for young men who had attained the age of twenty-one years since the previous registration. On August 24, 1918, a similiar registration was held for those who had attained the age of twenty-one since June 5. On September 12, 1918, a registration for all men between the ages of eighteen and forty-five years, excepting those who had been previously registered, was held. Questionaires were issued to all the above registrants, and about seventy-five per cent of the registrants of September 12th had been classified when orders were received from the Provost Marshal General to discontinue all classification.

The Provost Marshal General, recognizing the arduous duties of the Secretary of the Local Board, recommended the appointment of a chief clerk to assist that member. Mrs. Oliver Stevenson volunteered her services for this position.

In accordance with the Selective Service Regulations effective December 15, 1917, the Governor of the state was authorized to appoint a Government Appeal Agent for each local board, this step having been taken in recognition of the fallibility of all hodies exercising judicial functions. This duty was assigned to D. W. Livingston of Nebraska City, who efficiently and with untiring efforts represented the interests of the government and the individual.

In conformity with the regulations a Medical Advisory Board for the county was appointed by Governor Neville. Dr. A. P. Ginn as chairman, ably assisted by Dr. S. S. Wilson, both of Nebraska City, very efficiently carried on the work assigned them of determining the status of registrants who had taken appeals from the findings of the Local Board relative to their physical condition, or at the request of the Local Board for further examination.

The government, having in mind the interest of the registrant, and his possible lack of information relative to the Selective Service Regulations, made provision for the Legal Advisory Board. The following members were appointed: Judge A. A. Bischof, Chairman, and W. H. Pitzer and W. W. Wilson, all of whom reside at Nebraska City.

In July, 1918, the Local Board was advised to select and organize a Board of Instruction, whose object was to put the selective service men into camp willing, loyal, intelligent, clean and sober. Dr. S. P. Cresap was named as chairman, and Rev. W. W. W. Barnes and W. W. Metz, all of Nebraska City, W. W. Anness of Dunbar, and H. C. McKee of Palmyra, as associates. Their work, while brief, was of great value.

Over and above the personnel recorded above able service was rendered by individuals throughout the county. It redounds to the pride of the county to record that in but one or two instances all services were rendered without compensation.

The duties imposed upon the members of the Local Board were numerous and very exacting, and the responsibility at times was almost staggering. Men hitherto safe from the turmoil of life were being withdrawn from the shelter of homes to be thrown into the maw of a military machine. Public sentiment became a very potent factor not only in relation to the board but in the consciousness of every registrant. It was public opinion that enforced the draft law. The Local Board merely administered it. During the crisis there were probably few persons other than members of the Local Board who were afforded the opportunity of seeing the unselfish patriotism of men.


The unpatriotic and craven were so few as to be a negligible factor, and their cases were overshadowed completely by the examples of quiet and grim patriotism based upon a sense of duty. The board came into intimate contact with all classes of people, learned their trials and tribulations, their opinions.

prejudices and feelings, and sometimes their life history, containing faults carefully hidden from the world. Several instances stand prominent in the minds of board members, which when recalled touch a feeling of sentiment which renews their faith in human nature and American character. Two young men exemplifying these characteristics are now resting in France. One, a young man who was engaged in extensive farming, when questioned relative to his signing a waiver, exclaimed. "Don't talk to me about deferred classification, and don't permit a claim to be made in my behalf. My duty is with my Country, which has given me the opportunities which I now enjoy." The other, a young industrial worker, with

out any frothy enthusiasm, grimly denied the advances of a large corporation to obtain for him a deferred classification. There were many similiar cases of young men who made splendid records, and who were permitted to return safely to their homes. The administration of the draft brought forth many amusing incidents as well as pathetic ones.

Upon the signing of the armistice the duties of the Local Board ceased except for the compilation of statistics. Upon March 31, 1919, all records were shipped to the War Department at Washington, D. C., and on the 31st day of March the members received their official discharge, terminating the duties they had faithfully preformed since their appointment.

In each county a Government Appeal Agent was appointed. Immediately after each registration the work of the Government Appeal Agent began. The duties consisted of collecting information about each registrant who asked for deferred classification on any grounds, and submitting same to the Local or District Boards, having jurisdiction of the claim. Much time had to be devoted to collecting the evidence, all of which was submitted to the proper board in writing. Many times special reports were called for and furrished. Scrupulous care had to be

exercised to avoid injustice. Sometimes several investigations were necessary to develope the true facts in a case.

It was also his duty to appeal from the decision of the Board for either the Government or the registrant, where in his judgment an erroneous decision had been made. In Otoe County, except in formal appeals, the work of the Local Board was so thorough and its decisions so uniformly correct, no appeals were necessary and none were taken by the Government Appeal Agent.



WAR WORK ACTIVITIES IN OTOE COUNTY IN 1917

A brief statement of the Otoe County War Work organizations and results attained, made up from the War Service League Records may be of interest.

In response to appeals successively made to the country at large during 1917, special organizations of Committees were perfected by voluntary enlistment of Committee workers in every town and precinct of the County. No permanent organization was effected, but as each call for funds came, for Red Cross, Y. M. C. A., Liberty Bonds, K. of C., Y. W. C. A., successfully the same plan was followed. viz: a meeting was called of representatives from all the precincts and towns, a rough apportionment made and the local Committees met their allotments, at public meetings by personal canvass and by mailing lists.

THE WAR SERVICE LEAGUE ORGANIZATION

Committee work in these successive campaigns was not always fairly distributed. Many persons responded to these appeals with more than their fair share, in some instances, with more than they could afford. Others gave less than their share, or not at all.

It became apparent as the year closed that some permanent plan was needed for equalizing the burdens both of Committee work and of financing war funds, and to insure continued support of war work activities during the war.

In responce to a call a mass meeting was held in Nebraska City January 23, 1918, at which nearly two hundred men attended. They were men interested in patriotic work, and represented nearly every community in the County. It was at this meeting the War Service League of Otoe County was organized, with County officers Wm. H. Pitzer, Chairman, John C. Miller, Secretary and James T. Shewell, Treasurer. The organization was by precincts, the Committee plan being a Precinct Chairman and four or more Committeemen in each Precinct and Ward. In its published statement the objects to be attained by the organization were stated (in part) to be these:

To insure full performance by the people of Otoe County, during the war, of our duty in all approved lines of patriotic work.

To attain 100% loyalty in Otoe County.

To mobilize our entire strength for the support of our government and our enlisted men.

To perfect and preserve a complete record, not only for future Committee use, but also for other proper future reference, either by official authority, or in later years as historical data, of this organization, and of the record of the County, and each District, and of each citizen, in patriotic work.

Acting under the plan adopted all citizens who were heads of families and owners of property or receiving income (except men in the military service) were rated according to property and income, so that calls for financial aid in necessary War Work might be apportioned to all according to these two factors,—property and income. An Appeal Committee was provided for adjustment of grievances or errors in ratings and apportionments.

The above is a brief statement only of the Constitution and plan of the War Service League. It became known as the Otoe County plan of meeting County apportionments of War Work funds, and Liberty Bonds, and attracted wide attention. The League's booklet issued to members was published in full in the Journal of the American Bankers Association and the officers of the League received numerous inquires from other cities and communities as to the operation of the plan. It was closely followed in its organization and plan in a number of Nebraska Counties. Its success in Otoe County was pronounced, and its merit were first demonstrated in the Third Liberty Loan Campaign. More than 5000 names were enrolled and rated to whom the successive calls and quotas for Red Cross War and United War Work funds, and of War Savings Stamps and Liberty Bonds were apportioned.

This organization received the quotas for the County, determined the basis of an assessment for the particular purpose needed, and the funds and subscriptions needed to make up the County's quota were paid and subscribed through the Precinct Chairman. The War Service League had charge of the campaigns for Third Liberty and Fourth Liberty Loans, War Savings Stamps in 1918, Second Red Cross War Work Fund and United War Work Fund. In all of these the responses were surprisingly prompt, and in each case the County's quota was met and generally largely exceeded with a minimum amount of soliciting.

No salaries were paid. All campaign expenses were paid from an expense fund provided by assessment to the members. On January 23, 1919, the anniversay of the organization, it was unanimously agreed, in County meeting, that as the organization, was primarily an organization to help win the war, and to insure loyal support to the government and to our men under arms by all our people, the purpose of the War Service League had been accomplished, and the organization was discontinued except for the purpose of preserving and perpetuating the records of the year's work.

The duties of the board were to give all necessary advice and assistance in preparing claims, filling out questionnaires, and in preparing any other papers, required by the Selective Service Regulations to be submitted by registrants in the selection of citizens of this country for duty in the World's War.

WAR SAVINGS STAMPS

Hon. Paul Jessen, of Nebraska City, Chairman of the Twelfth District of Otoe County, of the war savings stamps committee worked hard and deligently to accomplish the organizing of war stamps committees in the different precints of Otoe county, which was done with a credit to everyone and Otoe county went "over the top" in selling its quota of War Savings Stamps. The county's quota for War Savings Stamps for 1918 was \$386,460 and when the big drive was put over and all War Savings Stamps committees had sent in their sales they amounted to 394,358, over subscribing the county's quota by \$7,898.00.

At first War Savings Stamps were sold in post offices throughout the country, but afterwards a separate drive was made to place more of them in the hands of patriots and savers. They were sold over the counters in the stores, rural mail carriers distributed them to their route patrons, school children organized W. S. S. committees, and for this reason there was no effort made to get names and photographs of those who distributed War Savings Stamps of which so many have done their bit by

selling and buying that it would be an unjustice to those who labored so hard on the drives if we should miss but one. But surely the government must be greatly pleased with the grand showing of Otoe county's purchases by its patriotic citizens of War Savings Stamps amounting to \$394,358 when it was in need of that money during the war.

The organization of the different committees throughout the county by the chairman and his associates, the organizing of the school children's W. S. S. Committees and others who help distribute War Savings Stamps have helped contract to a certain degree the habit "thrift" and "saving" which alone has accomplished a great lesson for them and especially the younger ones, as well as doing a great service for their country.

Precinct chairman and all committees worked hard, giving their time and subscribing for stamps to put the dirve in Otoe county "over the top" and to them who subscribed credit is given for the excellent showing. They have the satisfaction of having done a double service to their government and themselves.

FOOD ADMINISTRATION

Perhaps the least thanked and the most fervently cursed of all war activities were the conscientious efforts of the Food Administration in Otoe County, and this probably because for a long time the people themselves, and food conservation was ameasure which affected everyone, were not duly informed as to exactly what was expected of them in the matter of saving and conserving food and increasing production.

As Food Administrator for Otoe County Fred Cleveland received little credit for performing a public duty. In checking up sugar and flour regulations throughout the county and seeing to it that the requirements were lived up to by every family, he and his helpers had an enormous task. In many cases investigations were made which probably would not have been made had the offenders known the regulations and in many cases they might have been more familiar with the regulations had the system been made more clear by the National Food Administration. However, the work of the food administration was a success and sugar and flour was saved in large quantities.



The Nebraska City Chapter of Red Cross has one Auxiliar, Wyoming, and ten branches as follows: Otoe, Talmage, Syracuse, Palmyra, Burr, Unadilla, Douglas, Dunbar, Lorton and Delaware Precinct. Nebraska City has had her rooms open every day except holidays, every day for the past fifteen months, closing only during Chautauqua week and during weeks on account of the quarantine for Influenza.

The Red Cross collected and shipped 6600 lbs. of used clothing in March, 1918, and 2,800 lbs. in September 1918. They donated to Belgium March 1919, 2000 lbs. Relief 161 children's dresses and aprons, etc and eight knitted afghans. Also gave about 60 yards outing flannel remnants. Have shipped 147 boxes.

SYRACUSE BRANCH

The Syracuse Branch of the American Red Cross was organized June 15, 1917. From that time until January 1919, the women of the organization worked unceasingly for the soldiers at home and abroad. During this period they knitted 926 garments, made 3115 surgical dressings and 3315 hospital garments. In May 1918 a Red Cross Auction was held which netted \$3010.38, of this sum \$2000 was put at interest. This money, with membership fees and gifts from local organizations, enabled the society to pay all running expenses and in May, 1919, turned \$2500 over to the National Red Cross. Amount of work done sweaters 212, socks 440, helmets 36, wristlers 98, child's sweaters 67.

Immediately upon its organization until the end of the war, the women of Talmage were at the Red Cross rooms weekly, knitting, sewing and working hard at whatever tasks were assigned them by the Nebraska City Chapter. The Surgical Dressing Department was efficiently supervised by Mrs. C. Gritzka and the surgical dressing work continued by the ladies until they were notified that no more of their articles were needed.

Beginning their task with an empty treasury, splendid work in devising ways and means for bringing it revenue as long as money was needed. Help came from Red Cross Membership drives, entertainments. Red Cross Auctions, etc. A splendid spirit of loyal and hearty co-operation prevailed throughout all the work. Talmage's record for Red Cross work during the World War is one of which she may always be proud. Pg. 116

The American Red Cross Knitting Society was organized in Dunbar, August 31, 1917 with Mrs. Charles Ganz as President and Mrs. Dr. A. R. Smith as Vice President and the first meeting was held on that date. Mrs. McKay of Nebraska City was present at the meeting and explained how the work should be done. The members went to work in earnest in their homes and soon the finished work began to roll in at the meeting room. They met every Friday afternoon in the M. W. A. Hall where they kept busy making all kinds of knitted articles for the boys who answered the call of their country in this World's War. Mrs. Ganz and Mrs. Smith were kept busy teaching some of the members how to do the work and finished up all the unfinished work that was turned in, but never the less all who took part in this noble work, did the work well and freely.

The Junior Department also played an important part in this great work and on each meeting day almost every member was present and you would indeed be surprised to see the amount of work the girls between the ages of 10 and 16 years turned in and the neat manner in which the work was done.





The Lorton Branch of the Otoe County, Chapter, Nebraska City, Neb., was organized on November 27th. 1917 at Lorton, Neb. the officers elected for the following year, Chairman, Mrs. James Murray, Vice Chairman, Mrs. C. H. Damme, Treasurer, H. W. Frerichs, Secretary, Mrs. Joel Eaton.

At first we had only a few workers but as the war continued more willing workers came in to assist with the great work of providing our boys over there with warm knitted articles, and with supplies for the hospital to be used for the wounded and sick.

When the call come for donations and assistance in the sale to be held, in order to raise funds to purchase the supplies, and again the call during the Christmas drive for new members, the majority responded promptly, at these times it was proven who were the real true Americans, by this is meant, those who responded willingly and wanted to do all they could to help the great cause and stand by the Stars and Stripes not those who donated or become members merely because they were afraid of the government or what other people might say, and yet, working secretly against this country and our flag.

On October 16th, 1918 at the annual meeting the following officers were elected for the year 1919, Chairman, Mrs. C. W. Wood; Vice Chairman, Mrs. F. H. Doerman; Treasurer, H. W. Frerichs; Secretary, Mrs. Joel Eaton.

From the time of organizing to the close of the war, this Branch furnished, in the knitting department, sweaters, socks, wristlets 183 pieces, in the sewing department, 166 pieces, making a good showing of willing workers for a small branch.

Osage Precinct, especially the southeastern part, was active in war work and especially is this true of the Ev. St. Pauls congregation, under the leadership of the able pastor Rev. John Abele. Those who took part in the various activities were Chas. P. Weber, Louis H. Schacht, Henry A. Schacht, August Doeden, D. William Kicker, Charles Hoelscher, Louis Weber, Karl Wellman and Fred Huhold. The members of the church purchased \$42,800 of Third Liberty Bonds, \$59,775.50 of the Fourth Loan, \$34,332.50 War Savings Stamps. They also gave 7,848.50 for the Red Cross and Y. M. C. A. making a total of \$134,956.50: No record could be obtained of the First and Second Liberty Loan Bonds.

Besides the money given for the Red Cross, much sewing, knitting and gathering up of old clothes was done. The first work done was by Miss Cornelia Kicker who knitted a pair of wristlets a young woman 18 years of age who died in February 1918. During the summer of 1918 the Ev. St. Paul Red Cross Auxiliary was organized with a membership of 56 with Mrs. Anna Weber, Chairman and Mrs. Anke D. Kicker, Secretary. The ladies from Osage worked with the Talmage Branch of the Red Cross.

The Douglas Branch of the American Red Cross was organized April 4th, 1918. Mrs. H. C. Walker was selected Chairman; Mrs. W. W. Smith, Vice-Chairman; Mrs. John Beetem, Secretary; Biss Bertha Brisco, Treasurer. Before they were formally organized the patriotic women of Douglas had been kniting and many garments had been donated. After the organization was completed work was begun on hospital garments and the Douglas quotas were promptly filled. Within a few months, eighty-seven suits of pajamas, thirty-five morning jackets, fifteen convalescent robes, ten pinafores, and fifty pairs of drawers were sent in to Headquarters. Seventyeight soldiers' sweaters, one hundred and ninety-four pairs of socks, twenty pairs of wristlets, seven mufflers, three helmets, thirty-three children's sweaters and sixteen pairs of stockings were knitted. A large box of shoes and five hundred, forty-six garments were sent to the Belgian Relief Committee.

Douglas has a total Red Cross membership of eight hundred, thirteen. An unusual spirit of cooperation and genuine patriotism was mainfested by all the workers and one splendid phase of the work of the Chapter was the cultivation of an exceptional atmosphere of friendliness among the people of the community. So many women were notably generous in devoting their time and untiring efforts to the Red Cross, that it is impossible to mention one or two as being especially active.

There was never at any time the least difficulty in regard to finances as the greater part of the funds came from volunteer donations rather than sollicited subscriptions. In May, 1919, one thousand dollars were sent to the National Fund. All expenses have been promptly provided for and a sum has been retained for whatever the Red Cross may require in the future.



Officers and 3 Sergeants. The Company took part in five battation drills. In December 1918, through orders of Governor Neville the Company was ordered to disband.
